RESOLUTION OF THE CITY AND BOROUGH OF JUNEAU, ALASKA

A RESOLUTION HONORING AND THANKING ALL THOSE INDIVIDUALS WHO WORKED TO ENSURE DEFEAT FOR BALLOT MEASURE #3 AND VICTORY FOR THE PEOPLE OF ALASKA IN THE 1994 ALASKA GENERAL ELECTION.

WHEREAS, in 1994 Alaskan voters once again were presented with a ballot proposition to move the capital from Juneau, and

WHEREAS, once again, citizens throughout the state responded by providing their time, energy, ideas, and money in an effort to educate the voters about the cost, inequities, and disadvantages of the proposed move, and

WHEREAS, the campaign benefitted from every button that was distributed, every flyer that was mailed, every phone call that was made, and every friend who was lobbied to vote against the capital move, and

WHEREAS, once again the effort was successful, the proposition was decisively defeated, and Juneau remains the Capital City, and

WHEREAS, it is right and fitting that the Assembly should express the gratitude of the people of the City and Borough of Juneau to all those who worked on the campaign;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE ASSEMBLY OF THE CITY AND BOROUGH OF JUNEAU, ALASKA:

1. The Assembly gratefully acknowledges the efforts of individuals throughout Alaska who worked so hard in the campaign against Ballot Proposition #3. The Assembly particularly notes the contributions of former Governor Jay Hammond, Chair of the Alaska Committee; former Mayor Jamie Parsons, organizer of the Alaska Committee; Marilyn Heiman, Executive Director of the Alaska Committee, and every volunteer who walked through the rain and called through the night to make certain that the people of Alaska were fully informed about this issue.

2. The Assembly rededicates itself and the City and Borough of Juneau to ensuring that these efforts were well invested and that the people of Alaska have a Capital City that is accessible, responsive, and appreciated.


3. Effective Date. This resolution shall be effective immediately upon adoption.
