RESOLUTION OF THE CITY AND BOROUGH OF JUNEAU, ALASKA

A RESOLUTION HONORING AND THANKING THE ALASKA FEDERATION OF NATIVES FOR ITS SUPPORT IN THE CAMPAIGN TO ENSURE DEFEAT FOR BALLOT MEASURE #3 AND VICTORY FOR THE PEOPLE OF ALASKA IN THE 1994 ALASKA GENERAL ELECTION.

WHEREAS, in 1994 Alaskan voters once again were presented with a ballot measure to move the capital from Juneau, and

WHEREAS, once again, communities and organizations across the state responded by committing their prestige, resources, and ideas in an effort to educate voters about the cost, inequities, and disadvantages of the proposed move, and

WHEREAS, the campaign benefitted from each resolution that was enacted, each commitment that was made, and each constituent who was persuaded to vote against the capital move, and

WHEREAS, once again the effort was successful, the measure was decisively defeated, and Juneau remains the Capital City, and

WHEREAS, it is right and fitting that the Assembly should express the gratitude of the people of the City and Borough of Juneau to all those who supported the campaign;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE ASSEMBLY OF THE CITY AND BOROUGH OF JUNEAU, ALASKA:

1. The Assembly gratefully acknowledges the support of the Alaska Federation of Natives and thanks it for enacting a resolution which informed members of their stake in the defeat of Ballot Measure #3.
2. The Assembly rededicates itself and the City and Borough of Juneau to ensuring that these efforts were well invested and that the people of Alaska have a Capital City that is accessible and responsive.

3. Effective Date. This resolution shall be effective immediately upon adoption.
