RESOLUTION OF THE CITY AND BOROUGH OF JUNEAU, ALASKA

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY AND BOROUGH OF JUNEAU ACCEPTING THE DEED FOR THE RIGHT-OF-WAY FOR A STATE OF ALASKA ROUTE THAT HAS HISTORICALLY BEEN MAINTAINED BY THE CITY AND BOROUGH OF JUNEAU.

WHEREAS, the City and Borough of Juneau has historically maintained the South Franklin Street right-of-way belonging to the State of Alaska, and

WHEREAS, conflicts have arisen when third parties construct improvements on this right-of-way under state permits over which the city and borough has no jurisdiction, and

WHEREAS, the Alaska Department of Transportation and Public Facilities has agreed to transfer the South Franklin Street right-of-way to the City and Borough of Juneau, and

Whereas, CBJ 53.04.030 provides that real property to be acquired as a grant or as a part of a program of grants from the state government may be acquired only pursuant to a resolution of the Assembly, and

WHEREAS, the Alaska Department of Transportation and Public Facilities has agreed that this route shall, after transfer to the City and Borough of Juneau, retain their eligibility for federal aid under the Intermodal Surface Transportation Improvement Act of 1991;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE ASSEMBLY OF THE CITY AND BOROUGH OF JUNEAU, ALASKA:

1. That the Manager is authorized to accept the right-of-way of South Franklin Street from Admiral Way to Egan Drive from the State of Alaska:
2. That the Manager is authorized to execute a transfer and make a payment to the State of Alaska not to exceed ten dollars for this right-of-way.

3. Effective Date. This resolution shall be effective immediately upon adoption.
