## A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY AND BOROUGH OF JUNEAU, ALASKA

A RESOLUTION AMENDING THE PERSONNEL RULES TO ESTABLISH MARTIN LUTHER KING DAY AS A MUNICIPAL HOLIDAY AND AMENDING RESOLUTION SERIAL NO. 1136 TO PROVIDE FOR A JANUARY ASSEMBLY DATE NOT IN CONFLICT WITH MARTIN LUTHER KING DAY AND A FEBRUARY ASSEMBLY DATE NOT IN CONFLICT WITH PRESIDENT'S DAY.

WHEREAS, the vision and spirit of the Reverend Martin Luther King, Jr. are a part of America's legacy of freedom, and

WHEREAS, Dr. King's lifelong nonviolent struggle serves as a model to all those who would rise up and proclaim that they have a dream of a more just society, and

WHEREAS, it is altogether fitting and proper that a day be set aside in honor of Dr . King and his peaceful battle to secure liberty and justice for all Americans;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE ASSEMBLY OF THE CITY AND BOROUGH OF JUNEAU, ALASKA:

1. That Rule 707.1 of the Personnel Rules of the City and Borough of Juneau, Alaska is amended to read:

7 07.1 The following days are observed as holidays:
(I) the first of January, known as New Year's Day
(2) the third Monday in January, known as Martin Luther King Jr.'s Birthday
(3) the third Monday in February, known as Presidents Day
(4) the last Monday in March, know as Seward's Day
(5) the last Monday in May, known as Memorial Day
(6) the fourth of July, known as Independence Day
(7) the first Monday in September, known as Labor Day
(8) the 18 th of October, known as Alaska Day
(9) the lith day of November, known as Veteran's Day
(10) the fourth Thursday in November, known as Thanksgiving
(ll) the day after Thanksgiving
(12) the 25 th day of December, known as Christmas
(13) every day designated as a holiday by proclamation or resolution by the Assembly of the City and Borough of Juneau.
2. That Rule $2 A$ of the Assembly's Rules of Procedure as set out in Resolution Serial No. 1136 is amended to read:
A. The Assembly shall regularly meet on the first and third Monday of each month at 7:00 pom., except that it shall meet on the second and third Monday of September in order to avoid conflict with Labor Day, on the first and second Monday of January in order to avoid conflict with Martin Luther King, Jr. Day, and on the first and second Monday of February in order to avoid conflict with President's Day.
