RESOLUTION OF THE CITY AND BOROUGH OF JUNEAU, ALASKA

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE MANAGER TO APPLY FOR A GRANT FROM THE FEDERAL AVIATION ADMINISTRATION AND TO EXECUTE SUCH GRANT AGREEMENT IN USUAL FORM IN AN AMOUNT OF UP TO \$276,777 FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF SECURITY FENCING AND ELECTRIC VEHICLE GATES AT THE AIRPORT.

WHEREAS, the Juneau International Airport requires controlled access of persons and vehicles onto the airport air operations area pursuant to the Airport Security Plan and Federal Air Regulations Part 107, and

WHEREAS, construction of airport security fencing with electric gates is identified in the City and Borough of Juneau Six-Year Capital Improvement Program and was included in a previously submitted Federal Aviation Administration Preapplication, and would provide needed security fencing, and

WHEREAS, it is anticipated that AIP grant funds in an amount of up to \$276,777 will be made available by the FAA for said construction project, and

WHEREAS, the required 6.25 percent local match for this project is available in previously appropriated funds for airport improvements;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE ASSEMBLY OF THE CITY AND BOROUGH OF JUNEAU, ALASKA:

That the manager is authorized to apply for a grant 1 1. from the FAA in an amount of up to \$276,777 for said project and upon approval of such application may execute said grant in substantially the same form as previously approved by the Assembly for past AIP grants. The manager is authorized to execute such agreements and to give such assurances as are required under the AIP grant program and to carry out the terms and conditions of such grant. The manager or the manager's designee, or such other officer as is required by law or regulation, is authorized to do such acts as are required in connection with the execution of the grant agreement and the performance of its terms; further, the manager or the manager's designee is authorized to execute such requisitions as may be required for payment from the FAA of funds pursuant to said agreement.

2. The Assembly recognizes that if the cost of the project for which the grant is made exceeds the cost estimate used as a basis for the grant, such cost overruns do not entitle the municipality to additional federal funding; however, the manager is authorized to apply for such additional funds for said project as may become available if the Assembly has appropriated funds which may be used as the match for such additional or increased grant funding. The manager may execute such grant agreements or amendments as are required for such increased or additional funding.

3. Effective Date. This resolution shall be effective immediately upon adoption.
