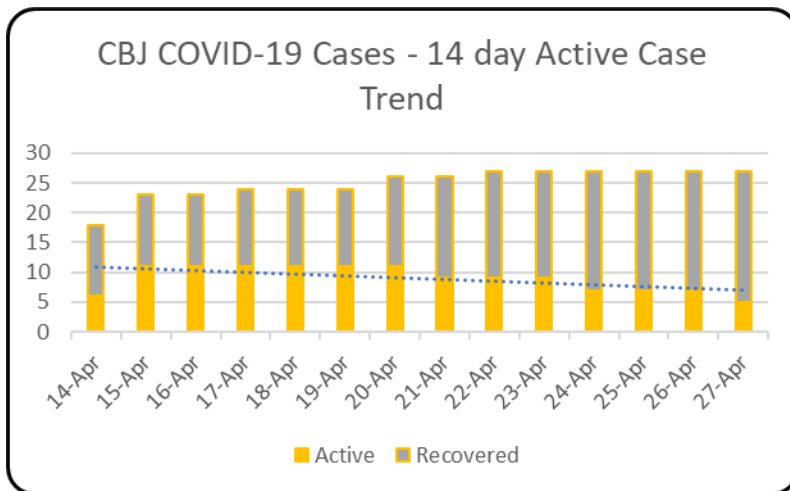

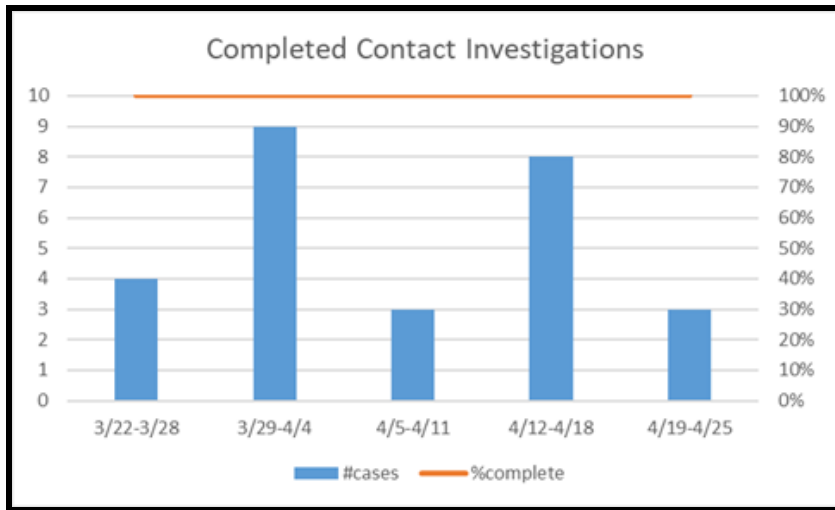

This information was just shared with us today and will be shared weekly on an ongoing basis. We do receive a daily update from DPH on PUIs and recovered individuals. Also, we have offered DPH additional resources for contract tracing which they don't feel they need. They do understand that we can provide additional resources if needed.

CBJ Operations continue with staff reassigned to EOC functions where appropriate. Minor staff outages due to childcare and medically advised quarantine. Staffing issues are not impairing operations.

BRH Operations continue as normal. They have limited staff out due to illness or quarantine. Staffing issues are not impairing operations.

Supply chain is operational with no significant reported shortages.

## EOC Highlights

Operational Period 10 (4/23/2020 – 4/30/2020). Unified EOC meeting today.

Working on obtaining community wide test kit availability – we are currently reporting out on tests completed citywide.

BRH: Working on employee exposure directives and working on a draft for employee testing.

## Operational Highlights

Airport Screening: Screened 12 passengers out of a total of 29 arriving.

Mobile Screening: 4 calls came into the hotline, screened 4, resulting in 3 appointments. There were 4 tests at drive through and 0 at home. To date, sampled 300 for testing. 2 welfare checks completed at home.

Vessel Screening: AMHS reported the following: screened 12 from Skagway, 5 from Haines, 8 from Angoon.

Warming Shelter: 48 overnight at the Armory.

Mt. Jumbo: No clients

Feeding Task Force: Weekend “to go” bags were distributed at the Glory Hall and the Armory. Numbers were not reported. Security issues continue to be challenging. Removing park benches in front of ZGYC

Mill Campground: Up and running with 12 sites occupied yesterday.

BRH: Expanding registration areas and working on visitation policy.

Discovered 80 more small N95s in the donation boxes. Message to people in the public, it is safe to come to the hospital and get treatment if needed. All departments in the ancillary areas have good plans in place.

### **Monday Focus: Juneau School District**

#### **2020 Graduation Task Team**

A group of 25 representatives from each of our three high schools including Principals, Senior Class Advisors, Counselors, Student representatives, and Site Council/parent representatives has begun planning for graduation at the end of May. A survey of high school seniors and senior parents is currently open to help brainstorm ideas for celebrating the Class of 2020. The survey ends tomorrow. A districtwide plan for high school graduation will be completed by May 8.
