Situation Assessment: Our 14 day and 7 day case rates are at the moderate alert level. The community continues to see COVID spread in the community with a higher proportion of cases occurring in youth under the age of 19. Two variants of concern have been identified in Juneau - (UK/B1.1.7 and Brazil/P1). Case rates statewide are declining.

Issues of Note:

The CDC provided updated guidance that fully vaccinated individuals do not need to mask or social distance. CBJ Community Mitigation Measures were updated accordingly:

We had our first Youth clinic today at the high schools. 275 youth participated. There will be another clinic schedule for Monday at the middle schools. So far, 280 youth are registered for that event.

Capstone will begin providing vaccines at the Juneau International Airport tomorrow.

There are a number of clinics planned for May throughout the community. Many of these clinics were originally set up as 2nd dose clinics which will now also be offering the Janssen vaccine. Sign up for an appointment at juneau.org/vaccine or call 586-6000. Registration isn't required – the May 22 clinic will be open to drive-ups and the May 26 clinic will be open to walk-ins; choice of vaccine will be dependent on availability.

May 26, 12 – 4:30 p.m. at True North Federal Credit Union, 2777 Postal Way.



Disease Transmission/Contact Tracing:

We are reporting 4 new resident cases and no new nonresident cases. The 4 cases are secondary transmission. In addition, our numbers have been adjusted to add in 3 older cases, (2 nonresident and 1 resident) that were not previously reported. The private party cluster has 8 positive cases with 1 person recovered.

That State is reporting 109 new cases today bringing the statewide total to 69,464 cases. This is a total of 197 new cases since the last EOC report.



Testing: 322 COVID tests were processed at BRH since the last EOC report, all tests returned in less than 24 hours.



Total: **60.1%** of the of the total population of Juneau has received at least 1 dose of vaccine and **56.5%** have completed their vaccine series.

12+: **70.1%** of the age eligible Juneau population has received at least 1 dose of vaccine. **65.8%** have completed their vaccine series.

65+: **94.5%** of this age group has at least one dose of vaccine. **91.2%** have completed the vaccine series.



This chart tracks the number of new cases in the past 7 days, controlled for population. King County (Seattle) and Multnomah County (Portland) are included for context and due to travel frequency. The source data for Alaska is from the SOA dashboard. Out of state data is from the Harvard Global Health Institute (<https://globalepidemics.org/key-metrics-for-covid-suppression/>) and generally lags a day behind most of our other reporting. Policy recommendations at varying levels (<1, <10, <25, 25+) can be found on their website
