 RE: **Situational Update –Level 1 Minimal-** Operational Period 33 (05/20/21 – 06/30/21)

**Situation Assessment:** The 14 and 7 day case rates are at the low alert level. The community continues to see COVID spread in the community with a higher proportion of cases occurring in youth under the age of 19. Three variants of concern have been identified in Juneau - (Alpha/B.1.1.7, Beta/B.1.351, and Gamma/P1). Case rates statewide are declining.

**Issues of Note:**

We had a joint EOC meeting today:

BRH: reports they are largely back to business as usual. They've had 2 COVID positive patients over the last several weeks both of whom were discharged fully recovered. Hospital census is high with normal type of operational issues.

JSD: The district has almost completed the first round of summer school. They have had no COVID related program impacts over the session. Regular session begins on August 16<sup>th</sup>. Youth who wish to be fully vaccinated by the beginning of school must receive their first dose of vaccine by July 12<sup>th</sup>.

Vaccine availability for youth under the age of 12 is under discussion for the September/October time frame.

13 individuals received a vaccine dose at the Monday afternoon/evening clinic at the valley movie theatre. Juneau Public Health clinics have been averaging around 50 doses per week. The Chamber of Commerce has increased their incentive program to allow for 2, \$20 gift cards for a first dose and 1 \$20 gift card for a second dose. Anyone receiving a dose from June 3 – June 29 will also be entered into a drawing for one of 5, \$1000 cash prizes.

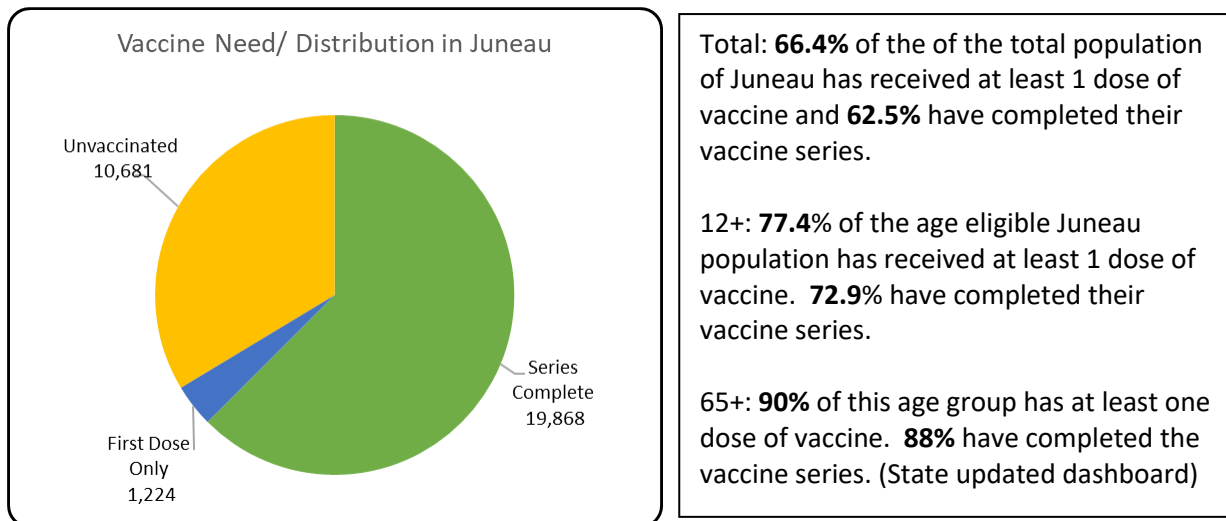

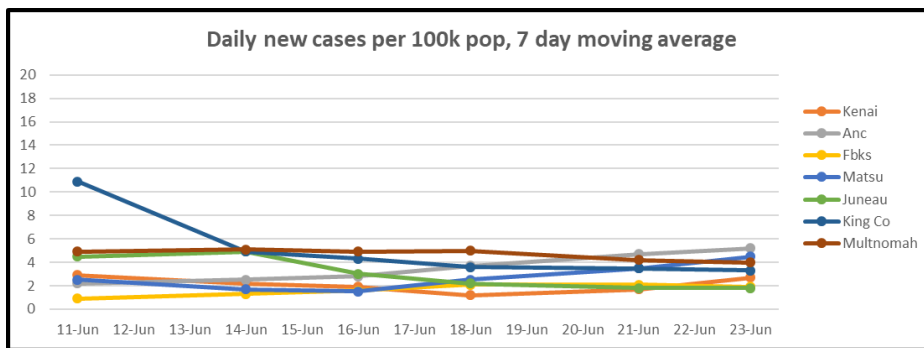
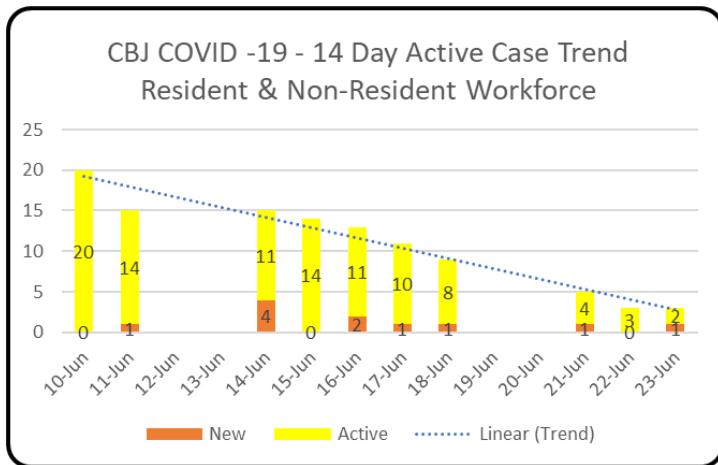
**Disease Transmission/Contact Tracing:**

We are reporting 1 new resident case and no new nonresident cases. The reported case is under investigation.

That State is reporting 74 new cases within the past 3 days bringing the statewide total to 71,037 cases.

58 COVID tests were processed through BRH since the last EOC report, all with less than 24 hour turnaround





This chart tracks the number of new cases in the past 7 days, controlled for population. King County (Seattle) and Multnomah County (Portland) are included for context and due to travel frequency. The source data for Alaska is from the SOA dashboard. Out of state data is from the Harvard Global Health Institute (<https://globalepidemics.org/key-metrics-for-covid-suppression/>) and generally lags a day behind most of our other reporting.
