

THE TIDE LINE

Port Director's Corner: Turning the calendar from October, officially marks the end of a busy and successful summer season. With the departure of the NORWEGIAN JEWEL on October 24th, Juneau welcomed 1,677,935 passengers from large cruise vessels and 9905 passengers from the small cruise vessels. This was approximately an increase of approximately 40K passengers over 2023. We anticipate a similar volume in 2025 with the first arrival on April 14th and the last departure on October 14th. Docks & Harbors is always forward looking to see what improvements can be made to our operations and to our facilities which makes Juneau attractive to both the visitors experience and to our local patrons. This chart depicts the 2024 large cruise ship passenger numbers. The "total" category reflects the "lower berth" capacity which assumes two adults per stateroom. Since many traveling couples bring children or others on the cruise, the actual passenger counts may exceed the advertised or total capacity. The percentages listed below show that trend.

Wayside Park Float
Dredging Project: Docks &
Harbors opened bids for the
project to dredge 5500 cubic
yards under the Wayside
Park Float on October
8th. Two bidders submitted
offers and Rock-N-Road
Construction of Petersburg
was awarded a contract for
\$797,000. The contract

requires the work be accomplished prior to the end of the year and the dredge material will be placed in Gastineau Channel off Channel Drive. This area has been permitted by ADNR and Docks & Harbors has received all necessary US Army of Engineers permits for the work. The funds for this project were provided through the 2022 1% Sales Tax Initiative.

In September, Kevin has stepped away from his formal duties as he focuses on recuperating from a stroke. The Docks & Harbors team has Kevin in our prayers as he continues to recover at home in Juneau.

New Boat Shelter Ownership Opportunity: Docks & Harbors is in the process of advertising to any patron wishing to construct a new boat shelter for their personal use at Aurora Harbor G Float. The requirement to submit an offer for this exclusive use can be found on our website here, which includes:

- Successful applicant will be selected based on the highest sealed bid
- \$100 non-refundable application fee and minimum bid \$500
- Successful applicant must construct the boat shelter by January 2026
- Boat Shelter may not exceed the maximum length of the longest boat shelter on Float G
- Applicant must retain ownership of at least ½ of the Boat Shelter through January 2031
- Applicants must secure all applicable building permits through CDD

Regulations Changes: At a <u>Docks & Harbor Special Board Hearing on October 31st</u>, the Board approved and recommended to the Assembly to make changes to five regulations. There were no written or oral comments received to these regulation changes during the notice period or at the public hearing. The proposed regulations broadly make the following changes:

- (a) Increase the tour sales permit minimum bids by \$5,000.
- (b) Disallow moorage until all accounts with collections have been paid in full;
- (c) Require pre-payments for habitual offenders who have been sent to collections of gone through the impound process;
- (d) Establish requirements for uninsured vessels, and
- (e) Establish a fee for unauthorized moorage at the Auke Bay Loading Facility.

Of note, under (d) is the replacement of the \$0.31 per foot per month "Vessel Salvage & Disposal" Fee with an annual, Board adjustable \$1.50 per foot per month "Uninsured Vessel Surcharge".



This change was necessitated by the large number of uninsured vessels sinking in the Juneau harbors in which Harbor Enterprise funds have been exhausted in resulting disposal costs. The Assembly will consider these recommendations at their regular meeting on November 18th at 7 pm. The public will have the opportunity to comment on these proposed recommendations.
