- CBJ, USFS, State of Alaska and Trail Mix, Inc.
- JTMP covers over 170 miles of trails and beach access borough-wide
- JTMP will...
 - Provide coordination and connectivity for the maintenance & development of the trails system
 - Identify high-priority trails and trail corridors
 - Identify and address gaps in the current trail system
 - Provide guidance to Trail Mix, Inc. for evaluating and funding trail projects
 - Identify new community partners



 - Draft plan out for public comment






89% report using trails at least one day per week

- 2. Airport Dike (26%)
- 3. Treadwell Ditch (24%)
- 4. Brotherhood Bridge (22%)
- 5. Outer Point/Rainforest (20%)

- 6. East Glacier (19%)
- 7. Mount Roberts (19%)
- 8. Boy Scout (18%)
- 9. Eaglecrest trails (18%)
- 10. Dredge Lake trails (17%)





When choosing a trail to use, what factors influence your decision?


