
One of the artists selected by this new process was photographer Micheal Francis Kelly. Kelly will open Dance of Light a photographic exploration of the unique formations frozen

City Museum receives donation of original letters by Richard Harris from John Harris McKay...


Juneau Alaska Sept. 30th 1897 October 6th

My Dear Niece Lizzie, Weir, McKay.

I received your kind and welcome letter of Aug. 25th and its contents noted, which found me in excellent health and I feel so glad you are all well. I received a letter today from Your Cousin Mary A. Harris. She has got married on the 24th Aug, [t]his man's name is T.C. Dobbins. He is Superintendent of the Electric Light Co. in Teluride, Colorado, this is his third venture. My two nephews William J. + Samuel Harris came out here before their Father Died. Samuel, I sent home as he had not been Married long, And William J., I sent to the Clondike Gold fields on the Yukon, I gave William One year provisions and Clothing and 250 Dollars in Money in all over Six Hundred Dollars, I have been out one Thousand Dollars altogether on the two Boys, there is great excitement here abought the Yukon Gold Mines. You wanted to know all abought it the distance from here is abought 850 miles to the Clondike it is all good travel in the spring of the year, as there is only a Small Portage of 30 miles from Salt Water – over unto the head of the Yukon River And from the Head waters to the mines

Museums Alaska/ Alaska Historical Society Joint Conference comes to Juneau this October



Many moons ago, the Alaska Historical Society had a committee about museums. 1983, that committee separated and became Museums Alaska, our statewide professional organization including more than 60 institutions and nearly 200 members. two organizations hold a joint annual conference, and this year Juneau is the location! The Juneau-Douglas City Museum and the Gastineau Channel Historical Society are teaming up to host the event. On Thursday, October 5, a free public lecture will be given by Harmer Johnson, an appraiser and consultant who has appeared on the Antiques Roadshow and worked with auction houses for more than 45 years. The event will be held at the Gross 20th Century Theater downtown on Front Street from 7-9pm.

The Museums Alaska conference theme is "For Sale? Museums, Markets, and the Ethics of Collecting." Sessions will include topics such as public art, legal aspects animal parts in art, and the tension between using and preserving collections. Ethical dilemmas in collecting will be highlighted, such as the issue of exhibiting archaeological

ivory from St. Lawrence Island and the complexities of collecting culturally sensitive material or items from disasters. Special speakers will include Professor Ron McCoy from Emporia State University (and frequent contributor to American Indian Arts magazine) and David Shayt from the Smithsonian's National Museum of American History.

The Alaska Historical Society theme is "Passages: What Were They Seeking?" Session topics include Russians Tlingit America, the Alaska Highway, the 1937 WPA Alaska Art Project, Alaska in textbooks, Dena'ina heritage, Spanish explorers in Alaska, missionaries in Unalaska, potatoes (!), early subsistence in Bristol Bay, the Chirikov expedition on Yakobi Island, publishing in Alaska, and the "best 67 books on Alaska history." Many sessions focus on historic people, including Sheldon Jackson, James Wickersham, and Adelbert von Chamisso. For those interested in more local topics, there are sessions about the ship the Princeton Hall, Father Hubbard on the Juneau Icefield, Tlingit ship pilots,

2006 shipwreck investigations on Lynn Canal, and the search for the Northwest Passage.

Various events and tours will be offered as well, including a cruise to Orca Point Lodge for dinner Thursday October 5, where Dick Wood will present a slide show from his spectacular collection of antique Alaskan glass lantern slides. Tours of local attractions are offered, and those registering for the conference will be able to participate in free behindthe scenes tours of local history venues. The conference always offers a terrific silent auction of historic items and collectibles, with proceeds benefiting museums and historical societies statewide.

Most events will take place at Centennial Hall from October 5-7. Registration for the full conference is \$205. Single day or half-day registration to the meetings is \$60 per day (\$30 half-day) and only \$15 per day for students. Members of Museums Alaska or the Alaska Historical Society can register for the full conference for \$175. (Yes, you can become a member!) Special events cost extra.
