In recognition of Breast Cancer Awareness month, the City Museum will be hosting the 2008 Bra-Dazzler, a brainspired art exhibition cosponsored by Team Survivor Perseverance. An opening reception will be held on Friday, October 3, from 4:30 to **7:30pm**. The exhibit will be on display through November 1. and will feature art from five categories: mixed media, painting/prints, photography, sculpture, and a new special category – fitness-themed. Justine Emerson will present Vitamin D: Its Role in Cancer Prevention and Good Health on Saturday, October 11, at 10:30 a.m. in conjunction with the exhibition.

Rachael Juzeler, a multimedia artist is our November solo artist. Juzeler's exhibition, *Rough Around the Edges* continues her exploration with pit-fired ceramics, wire bas-


kets, felting and resin to form her sculptural pieces. Other pieces, such as "Cot in the Middle," are influenced by quilting. The opening reception will be held **Friday**, **November 7**th, **4:30–7:30**. The exhibit runs through November 29, 2008.

The Juneau-Douglas City Museum is pleased to welcome back printmaker/ photographer Larry McNeil who will exhibit with us December 2008 through January 2009. McNeil, a professor of photography at Boise State University in Idaho, has won many awards for his photography, including the National Geographic Roads Photography Award, the Eiteljorg Fellowship, and the New Works Award from En Foco.

This exhibition will consist of hand-made lithographs and prints as a continuation of his "Fly by Night Mythology" works, as well as prints from recent projects such as the "Arts in Embassies Project", a project involving several Native Artists from across the Nation to create artwork for American embassies around the world.

Larry McNeil's *Solo Exhibition* opens on **December 5**th from **4:30 to 7:30** and will run through January 31, 2009.

In addition to our upcoming exhibits, the Museum is also proud to announce the return of the *Coffee & Collections* Series. Each month we will feature a different presenter to discuss topics relating to Juneau's history, art and culture. We have quite an exciting line-up for the Fall. Hope you will join us! GRANT-IN-AID 2009 PROJECT TO FOCUS ON COLLECTIONS

We are already beginning work on our 2009 Grant-in-Aid Project. This year we will be making some modifications to areas of the basement in accordance with the facility plan we put together last year with MRV Architects.
