Port Director's Corner

For Docks & Harbors, April is the month that bridges the extremely busy winter with the nearly chaotic summer season we experience in Juneau. To help mitigate potential conflicts where multiple users (or user groups) are competing for the same resource, Docks & Harbors sponsors pre-season meetings to bring the interested public together to discuss the governance of various facilities. As a member of TBMP (Tourism Best Management Practice), we partner with the organization and its membership to seek ways to better coordinate access to facilities under Docks & Harbors management.

On April 28th, at 5:00 pm at the Mendenhall Library, we will be hosting a meeting for all Statter Harbor users groups. This includes recreational boaters, charters operators, commercial fisherman, and transportation companies. The staff will discuss managing Statter Harbor primarily as a transient facility, the TBMP protocols for both vessels and busses, and opportunities for off-site parking.

On April 28th, at 9:00 am and again on April 29th at 2:00 pm in the Assembly Chambers, the Docks & Harbors downtown supervisors will be briefing on the expectation for coaches, busses, shuttles, taxis and privately owner vehicles to operate in the lots managed by the department. These parking lots include Marine Park (aka Brickyard), the Cruise Ship Terminal (formerly known as the Visitor's Center), the Columbia Lot (adjacent to the Tram), the Taku Lot (adjacent to the Twisted Fish), "B zones" in the vicinity of the Red Dog and portions of the Archipelago Lot (dirt lot south of the library). On April 28th at 10:00 am and again on April 29th at 3:30 pm, there will be a voluntary meeting, again led by the downtown supervisors, to discuss the rules and expectations pertaining to the vendor booths (aka Waterfront Sales Permit). This year, as in previous years, with 2014 being an exception, there will be eleven companies selling tours from three locations along the waterfront. The permits are tightly regulated and conduct is enforced by Docks & Harbors officers.

Statter Harbor Launch Ramp & Parking mitigation. As mentioned above, Docks & Harbors has worked with Auke Bay Elementary School, UAS and First Student (Bus Barn) to provide additional parking to offset the losses experienced with the on-going construction project. The link below is a tri-fold produced by Docks & Harbors to help the public understand the parking options. Docks & Harbors will enforce the parking at these three locations based on agreements with each owner. In general, vehicle-only parking is allowed at the Auke Bay Elementary School & UAS campus; and, trailers (with vehicles) only at the First Student lot. Each lot has requirements for maximum lengths of stays. Do not be discouraged with the walking distance from the UAS campus - there is a short cut (shown in the tri-fold) making the walk less than 9 minutes. Below is the link to the parking tri-fold.

Meetings, meetings & more meetings: The CBJ Assembly recently approved Docks & Harbors proposed regulations affecting the fees charged to charter operators and the minimum bid amount to participate in the Vendor Booth outcry auction.

The proposed changes are now being reviewed by CBJ Law before commencing another public notification period of 21 days and public hearing at an upcoming Board Meeting. You can buy your launch ramp permit at Statter Harbor, Aurora Harbor, or online at www.juneauharbors.com. As a reminder, launch ramp permits are issued for the calendar year and are required at all Docks & Harbors launch facilities.

At a March 31st Harbor Fee Review Meeting, the committee proposed a set of guidelines for managing the new Statter Harbor Launch Ramp facility and set fees at the same level as they exist now at Statter Harbor. The management guidelines and fee structure will be reviewed at April's Operations-Planning Committee, the Finance Committee, and the regular Board Meeting. On April 15th, the Harbor Fee Review Committee will begin to discuss the harbor moorage rates. The Docks Fee Review Committee will next meet on April 23nd to discuss the fees associated with coaches, busses and other users of Docks & Harbors "loading zones". Industry representatives and the public are encourage to attend and participate.

Aurora Harbor Rebuild: This project continues to be on schedule for a May 31st substantial completion and Trucano Construction has demobilized as all pile driving work is complete. At a patron's request, we are researching the opportunity to bring hardwired phone lines and cable TV to the new construction. The decision not to bring wires and cables was strategically made after public meetings during the design process. Social Media: There has been social media discussion regarding the reliability of WiFi in the harbors. In response, SnowCloud is a service which started about 10 years ago and is owned by Southeast Communication Services. It was started to provide an alternate solution for AT & T's wimax that was discontinued. The service started by providing internet from a high site that looked over the Harbor. It worked so well that the service was expanded to several locations across town and to many business's and state agencies. This service is faster than DSL, and with their latest package it is cheaper. Docks & Harbor has recently engaged in discussions on colocation options to bring this network within the Harbor to be closer to their customers.
