





Port Director's Corner

With summer now upon us - May has come & gone with many items of note for Docks & Harbors. We completed three ribbon cutting ceremonies for the new Cruise Ship Dock project, the Statter Harbor Launch Ramp and the opening of Mike Pusich Douglas Harbor. We held a public meeting (aka the Boat Shelter Expo) to update those affected by reconstruction scheduled for Aurora Harbor Phase II. Additionally, Docks & Harbors was tasked with coordinating the USS O'KANE visit to our Capital City. The following has been submitted to the EMPIRE for inclusion in the Sunday's Neighbors column. Unfortunately, there simply isn't room to thank everyone so I will apologize in advance for those I couldn't get a shout out to.

Thank you to the Juneau Community. From May 13th to May 18th, the USS O'KANE visited Juneau for a port visit en route to their homeport of Pearl Harbor. Many members of the community stepped up to ensure the 330 officers and crew were treated with hospitality and kindness. Kara Tetley of Travel Juneau met the vessel at anchor and provided a thorough overview of all recreational and local activities which the sailors could partake during their visit. Over 80 Juneau individuals volunteered in the Adopt-a-Sailor program inviting over 200 sailors to their homes or other destinations as local guides. The Adopta-Sailor program was spearheaded by past Navy League President Murray Walsh, Janice Holst and Docks & Harbors' Administrative Assistant Jennifer Shinn.

The American Legion Post 25, led by Commander John Cooper, held a Sunday afternoon BBQ and Mariann Cummings of M&M Tours provided transportation out to the post. Tom Dawson of the VFW ensured the welcome sign was prominently displayed and provided a photographic gift which Mayor Koelsch presented to Commander Sherwood, the O'KANE's commanding officer. Donna Hurley of the Lions Club expertly organized a USS JUNEAU wreath laying ceremony with participation of CDR Sherwood and other crewmembers of the O'KANE. There were numerous opportunities for restaurant/retail and discounted excursions courtesy of the Downtown Business Association (DBA) and TBMP tour companies - thanks to Dana Herndon and Kirby Day. Erik Borass of Trail Mix, Inc coordinated a service project in which several USS O'KANE sailors volunteered to conduct trail maintenance on Rain Forest Trail which Juneau Airport Shuttle provided transportation. The Navy's San Diego-based Pacific Fleet five piece ensemble provided free concerts as part of Juneau Jazz & Classics and participated in school outreach programs. Kristen Bartlett, Juneau School District, set up numerous school tours aboard the ship and arranged for O'KANE sailors to visit JDHS and spend time with special education students. Coach Casperson also provided open gym times for the Navy to play some basketball off the ship. Docks & Harbors employees Dave Borg and Matt Creswell found a way to decorate the downtown cruise ship docks with American flags. In all, there were scores of Juneauites who made the USS O'KANE's visit memorable, including Governor and Mrs. Walker who held a reception for the ship's officers at the Governor's House. CBJ is most appreciative of all who stepped up and volunteered their time and resources.
