Port Director's Corner

The month of May kicks off the Juneau boating and tourism season. It also marks a national weeklong event emphasizing "infrastructure". May 14-21, 2018, is the sixth annual Infrastructure Week (www.infrastructureweek.org), which is a national week of advocacy and education designed to raise awareness about why we need to invest in our infrastructure. To continue to ignore it puts our health and safety at risk, and our economy at risk too. Docks & Harbors will join the American Society of Civil Engineers and other trade and labor organizations commemorating the need to plan and invest in infrastructure. We have all heard the stories about tens of thousands of bridges past their useful lifespan, highways that need to be rebuilt, inland waterways that are neglected, drinking water and wastewater systems that cause public safety issues. Locally, we know that recent recapitalization projects at Douglas, Statter, and Aurora Harbors replaced floats that were in excess of 50 years old and well past their useful life. Docks & Harbors has previously recognized the need for systematic and planned improvements along the downtown waterfront leading to economic development.

The Juneau "Infrastructure Week" will take place each day of the work week and will emphasize "maintenance" as a critical element in realizing world class infrastructure. The public is cordially invited to attend any or all the scheduled Docks & Harbors events:

Docks & Harbors awarded for environmental stewardship: The City and Borough of Juneau Docks & Harbor Department was honored with the Environmental Stewardship Award by the <u>Pacific Coast Congress of Harbormasters</u> & <u>Port Managers</u> at its semi-annual conference in Coos Bay, Oregon on April 19.

The award acknowledged CBJ's "commitment to improve all aspects of the marine environment." It noted its "dedication to improving water quality and pollution prevention services for their customers," and the Port of Juneau's plan to "continue the reduction of nonpoint source pollution and protect all areas of the marine environment while providing boaters with a safe, proactive facility for all users." The Pacific Coast Congress was founded in 1974. Its membership is made up of ports and harbors from California, Oregon, Washington, Alaska and British Columbia. "It's rewarding to have professionals within the industry, throughout the Pacific Northwest, acknowledge the heavy lifting Juneau has been undertaking to improve our harbors," said Port Director Carl Uchytil, who was at the conference to receive the award. Uchytil gives credit to Harbormaster Dave Borg and staff for leading the efforts to reduce pollution, increase recycling efforts, and address derelict vessels and abandoned vehicles in the harbors and adjoining uplands. Uchytil also recognized Deputy Harbormaster Matt Creswell for his determination to achieve Alaska Clean Harbor certification. Docks & Harbors received the distinction in February for waste reduction, pollution prevention and clean boating.
