Port Director's Corner - Docks & Harbor Board Strategic Retreat: The Board routinely allocates special meetings to strategically plan long term needs and goals. The next Strategic Retreat will be held on Tuesday, November 12th at 5 pm at the DIPAC Board Room. Docks & Harbors is fortunate to be able to leverage the resources of Deputy City Manager Mila Cosgrove as our facilitator. In previous years, much of the strategic retreats were focused on project prioritization. Reporting Non-violent Harbor Crimes - New Tool: Help stop theft in our Harbors! Docks & Harbors is providing a computer at both Aurora Harbor and Statter Harbor Offices for the purpose of encouraging patrons to report criminal activity. We believe there is a barrier for some who do not have access to a computer to file police reports. The use of the computer is at no charge to the individual. Docks & Harbors continues to ask patrons who witness crime in the harbors to come forward and make reports to JPD. Surplus Boarding Floats For Sale: The old Statter Harbor launch ramp boarding floats are now available to the public via on-line auction:

The auction will stay open until November 12th. There are ten (10) 24' x 8.5' Boarding Floats, with timber construction and foam floatation, which are in fair condition. Successful bidders must remove the float(s) from the harbor within seven days of payment at new owner's expense. The floats are tied up to the Statter Harbor Breakwater and can be viewed at that location.

Zinc Anode Installation CIP: At the upcoming November 25th Assembly meeting, Docks & Harbors will be requesting Assembly “transfer” money from one CIP (Capital Improvement Project) to another. The request is to transfer the remaining \$123,163.89 from Amalga Harbor Fish Cleaning Station to a CIP to install zinc anodes at the downtown small boat harbors. The Pile Anode Installation CIP was established from the Docks & Harbors Board prioritization process to extend the useful life of newly recapitalized small boat harbor projects. Harris and Douglas Harbors have no zinc anodes installed. Aurora Harbor has approximately half of all its newly installed piles fitted with anodes.

Port Security Check Point Project: Docks & Harbors has issued Notice to Proceed to Southeast Earth Movers to construct two security check points at the entrance to the Alaska Steamship and Cruise Ship Terminal Floats. Much of the fabrication of the steel frame building will be conducted in Seattle. Southeast

Earth Movers will mobilize in early January to erect the frame/foundations and Perseverance Glass will install the windows. Below is a rendering showing a cruise ship behind the Port Security Check Point building and what the structure will look like when completed by April.
