RESOLUTION OF THE CITY AND BOROUGH OF JUNEAU, ALASKA

Serial No. 2050

A Resolution Calling for an Advisory Ballot Proposition on Northern Surface Transportation for Access to Juneau.

WHEREAS, surface transportation is an important issue for the Southeast region and Juneau Community, and

WHEREAS, it is in the public interest to continue improving access to Alaska's capital, and

WHEREAS, this policy would benefit from the advice of the voters, and

WHEREAS, the Assembly has decided to call for an advisory vote on surface transportation to be presented to the voters at the October 3, 2000 municipal election;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE ASSEMBLY OF THE CITY AND BOROUGH OF JUNEAU, ALASKA:

Section 1. Submission of Proposition to Voters. A proposition as set forth in Section 2 of this resolution shall be submitted to the qualified voters of the City and Borough at the next regular election to be held on October 3, 2000. The City and Borough Clerk shall prepare the ballot proposition to be submitted to the qualified voters as provided by this resolution and shall perform all necessary steps in accordance with law to conduct the election and place this proposition before the qualified voters at said regular election.

Section 2. Proposition. The proposition to be submitted to the voters as required by Section 1 shall read substantially as follows:

Explanation of Proposition

Through this ballot measure, the Assembly asks for your advice on improving access to Juneau. This is a non-binding measure.

Currently, surface transportation is available to and from Juneau by mainline ferries.

Two alternatives are available:

1. Enhanced ferry service.
2. A road.
