RESOLUTION OF THE CITY AND BOROUGH OF JUNEAU, ALASKA

A RESOLUTION SUPPORTING THE CONSTRUCTION OF A LEGISLATIVE HALL IN JUNEAU AND PLEDGING THE SUPPORT OF THE CITY AND BOROUGH OF JUNEAU IN A JOINT STATE-MUNICIPAL EFFORT TO CONSTRUCT THE HALL.

WHEREAS, at the general election of 1982, the voters of Alaska rejected the idea of moving the capital from Juneau to Willow, and

WHEREAS, the capital move proposal delayed construction of needed capitol facilities in Juneau, and

WHEREAS, there is a critical need for consolidated legislative space in Juneau, and

WHEREAS, the state of Alaska has commenced the planning and the acquisition of land for the construction of a new legislative hall in Juneau, and

WHEREAS, participation by the City and Borough of Juneau in the construction of the legislative hall may help assure its expeditious construction, and

WHEREAS, construction of a legislative hall in Juneau will benefit the state of Alaska;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE ASSEMBLY OF THE CITY AND BOROUGH OF JUNEAU, ALASKA:

1. That the assembly supports the construction of a legislative hall on the Telephone Hill site identified by the state and pledges its assistance as may be needed to assure the expeditious construction of the hall.

2. That the manager and attorney are authorized and directed to immediately negotiate with the state of Alaska such arrangements as may be appropriate and mutually agreeable that will implement the intent of paragraph 1 without obligating the municipality beyond the lease or other revenues to be received from the state under such agreements. 3. That the terms of any agreement with the state of Alaska must be approved by the assembly before execution.
