A RESOLUTION COMMENDING JOSEPH L. GEORGE FOR
HIS CONTRIBUTIONS TO THE CITY AND BOROUGH OF
JUNEAU.

WHEREAS, having resided in Juneau since 1912 and during that time he was a leader in the business community operating a grocery store and in later years a gift shop, and

WHEREAS, he was in the true spirit a pioneer of the State of Alaska, and over the years made many friends throughout Alaska, and

WHEREAS, in 1963 he ran for the Council of the City of Juneau and was elected, and served with distinction for two terms, and

WHEREAS, in 1967 the citizens of Juneau voted to have a Council-Manager form of Government and Joe George, on October 9, 1967, became the first elected Mayor under this form of Government, and


WHEREAS, during his service as a Councilman and Mayor his awareness of public needs and his leadership in providing services in the public interest contributed significantly to the betterment of the community;


1. That by this Resolution the members of the City-Borough Assembly, on behalf of the people of Juneau, pay tribute to this distinguished citizen; and
