RESOLUTION OF THE CITY AND BOROUGH OF JUNEAU, ALASKA

Serial No. 355

A RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING A YOUTH ADVISORY BOARD.

WHEREAS, the assembly finds that the problems of the youth of the community may be dealt with more effectively by improving the quality, delivery and coordination of youth programs and services for youth, and

WHEREAS, it is beneficial to have the advice and recommendations of interested and informed citizens of the community before making policy decisions relating to youth programs and services;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE ASSEMBLY OF THE CITY AND BOROUGH OF JUNEAU, ALASKA:

1. That there is hereby created a Youth Advisory Board consisting of nine members and composed as follows:

- A. One member from the Juneau Service Area (No. 1)
- B. One member from the Douglas Service Area (No. 2)
- C. One member from the Rural Non Areawide Service Area (No. 3)
- D. Four at large members
- E. Two youths who are under the age of 19 at the time of appointment.

2. That the initial appointment be for staggered terms as follows:

- A. Two youth members and two non-youth members for one year terms,
- B. Two non-youth members for two-year terms,
- C. Three non-youth members for three-year terms,


and that all subsequent appointments of non-youth members be for three years. Subsequent appointments of youth members shall be for one year terms. Terms of members shall end on March 1, but a member shall continue to hold office until his successor has been appointed and seated.

3. That members of the board shall be appointed who are interested or involved in youth problems and shall represent the community rather than an agency with which they may also be associated.


4. That the board shall:
- A. Investigate the problems and needs of youth and youth related problems in the community.
 - B. Evaluate the quantity, quality, delivery and coordination of youth programs and services in the community.
 - C. Report findings and recommendations to the assembly based on its investigations and evaluations. Reports may include recommendations to modify, consolidate, separate, initiate, delete and coordinate various youth programs and services. Reports shall also include sources of funding for existing and proposed programs and services.
 - D. Undertake such other activities as the assembly may, by motion, direct from time to time.
