WHEREAS, the Director of Region X, EPA, is authorized to make grants for environmental protection projects, and

WHEREAS, the contract for financial assistance will impose certain obligations upon the applicant, including the provision by it of the local share of project costs, and

WHEREAS, it is required by the Environmental Protection Agency in accordance with the provisions of Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, that in connection with the filing of an application for assistance, the applicant give an assurance that it will comply with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 and the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency requirements thereunder, and

WHEREAS, it is the goal of the Applicant that minority business enterprise be utilized to the fullest extent lawful and possible in connection with this project, and that definitive procedures shall be established and administered to ensure that minority businesses shall have the maximum feasible opportunity to compete for contracts when procuring construction contracts, supplies, equipment contracts, or consultant and other services;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE ASSEMBLY OF THE CITY AND BOROUGH OF JUNEAU, ALASKA:

- 1. That the Manager of the City and Borough of Juneau is authorized to execute and file an application on behalf of the City and Borough of Juneau, Alaska, with the Environmental Protection Agency to aid in the financing of the design of the Juneau-Douglas Waste Water Treatment Plant Sludge-Disposal Facility.
- 2. That the Manager of the City and Borough of Juneau is authorized to execute and file with such application an assurance or any other document required by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency effectuating the purposes of Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964.

- 3. That the Director of Public Works, the Director of Finance or the designee of either or any person designated by the Manager, is authorized to furnish such additional information as the Environmental Protection Agency may require in connection with the application or the project.
- 4. That the Manager of the City and Borough of Juneau is authorized to establish and execute such affirmative minority business policies as may be lawful in connection with the project's procurement needs.
