



### EOC Highlights

Operational Period 10 (4/23/2020 – 4/30/2020).

The EOC is working on obtaining community wide test kit availability – we are currently reporting out on tests completed citywide but are looking to accurately portray test kit availability.

DHSS provided guidance today on congregate, asymptomatic testing. Essentially, testing of this type is limited to congregate care facilities where the individuals housed have been there for over 14 days and do not have the ability to come and go freely from the facility. The examples given were the long term care facilities and prisons. This testing will be conducted by the Division of Public Health. The CBJ EOC is seeking further guidance on testing other populations who have the ability to move about during the day such as homeless, housing first, or other group housing settings.

### Operational Highlights

Airport Screening: Screened 4 passengers out of a total of 47 arriving. Slight uptick in number of passengers arriving. No passengers were screened because of social distancing issues.

Mobile Screening: 22 calls came into the hotline. There were 4 tests at drive through and 2 at home. To date, sampled 306 for testing. 3 welfare checks were completed via phone, 2 welfare checks completed at home.

Vessel Screening: AMHS will report on May 4.

Mt. Jumbo: No clients

Feeding Task Force: 34 breakfasts, 36 lunches, 38 dinners

Centennial Hall: Ready for use. Taskforce is meeting at 3pm to talk about staffing and operations.
