Supply chain is operational with no significant reported shortages.

<u>CBJ operations</u> continue with staff reassigned to EOC functions where appropriate. Minor staff outages due to childcare and medically advised quarantine. Staffing issues are not impairing operations.

<u>BRH Operations</u> continue as normal. They have limited staff out due to illness or quarantine. Staffing issues are not impairing operations.

April 9, 2020 Assembly EOC Update CBJ COVID-19 Response

EOC Highlights

EOC is part way through Operational Period 7 (4/8/2020 - 4/11/2020). Next operational period will be from 4/11 -April 16 and then weekly after that to align with Bartlett. We will adjust as needed if the incident escalates.

Both SEAHRC and BRH are expecting rapid testing machines. Once received, they will need to be validate prior to use. Tentatively, local testing available sometime next week.

Issues on the critical path continue to be set up and staffing for quarantine and isolation centers. Small scale isolation for unsheltered individuals awaiting test results has been stood up and is operational. Planning for childcare for essential workers continues.

Operational Highlights

<u>Airport Screening</u>: 19 passengers out of 31 arriving went through the voluntary screening process at the airport.

Mobile Screening: 11 calls came into the call center. 9 tests at drive through, 1 at home. To date, sampled 140 for testing.

<u>Vessel Screening</u>: Reached out to local marine freight companies for approved plans. Next ferry arrives on Friday.

Warming Shelter: had 37 individuals overnight.

Logistics Highlights

Centennial Hall is cleared out. Shower units are coming our way.

Community taskforce: 240 offers of help from volunteers. 45 requests for help.
