



## **EOC Highlights**

Operational Period 10 (4/23/2020 – 4/30/2020).

BRH reports they are prepared for a surge, memorializing their process, and beginning to open up to nonemergent services. Revisiting their patient visitation policy in light of that loosening up of services. Need to keep a careful eye on the burn rate of PPE and logistics of testing.

The EOC continues to work on obtaining community wide test kit availability.

State will conduct testing at the Pioneer Home. No broad based test at LCCC – will continue current protocols on inmate testing. Johnson Youth Center is considering broad based testing but will at a minimum, test incoming.

JSD reports meal service has been steady. They will not provide meal service over the summer. Planning for the end of the year and end of year celebrations.

### **Operational Highlights**

<u>Airport Screening</u>: Screened 2 passengers out of a total of 66 arriving. Slight uptick in number of passengers arriving. No passengers were screened because of social distancing issues.

<u>Mobile Screening</u>: 19 calls came into the hotline, 8 referred for testing. There were 8 tests at drive through. To date, sampled 314 for testing. 2 welfare checks were completed via phone.

Vessel Screening: Participated in DHSS webinar on Health Mandate 17.

Mt. Jumbo: No clients

Feeding Task Force: 34 breakfasts, 36 lunches, 38 dinners

Centennial Hall: Ready for use.

<u>BRH</u>: Looking at soft reopening of services. Sorting out pre-procedure testing and PPE burn. Balancing readiness with normal operations.

60 more PAPR hoods came in. Repurposing a trailer for sterile processing procedures. 1,000 testing swabs arrived yesterday. That boosts testing supplies significantly.

### Weekly Highlights

The past week has been very busy. Requests for assistance have increased rapidly and we are working to ensure everyone requesting assistance is provided with a supportive and non-judgmental response. We spoke with a woman this week who was calling for food assistance. She shared as we talked that her mother had died by suicide

the week before. We connected her with the Juneau Suicide Prevention Coalition to receive post suicide supportive information.

We have seen a jump in rental assistance requests, donated food, and cloth facemasks.

This week we worked closely with Alaskan Brewing Company to provide volunteers and a CBJ staff to assist with the Brewery's efforts to provide free hand sanitizer to the community for a two-week period.

Additionally, we referred several volunteers to ROCK Juneau to assist with writing uplifting notes that are placed in the school meals that are picked up daily by families. Notes are written in Tlingit and English.
