 RE: City & Borough of Juneau COVID-19 Response – Emergency Operations Center Update

Situational Update – Incident Level 2 - Operational Period 13 (5/14/2020 – 5/28/2020).

EOC shifted to a two week operational cycle to match the BRH cycle.

Disease Transmission/Contact Tracing:

There were no new cases identified today. The last two cases were back dated to April 28th and April 30th, and based on when they reported their symptoms began and ended, they are considered recovered. DPH is currently following 5 individuals as persons under investigation.

Testing:

PCR testing capacity and supplies remain good for current levels of testing, we continue to be tight on rapid testing kits which can be locally processed. The EOC continues to explore options for increasing the ability for local testing. Testing of people who are currently experiencing homelessness is tentatively scheduled for May 19 & 20. We will stand up Centennial Hall during that process to house individuals who report that they are symptomatic when screened.

Hospital Response:

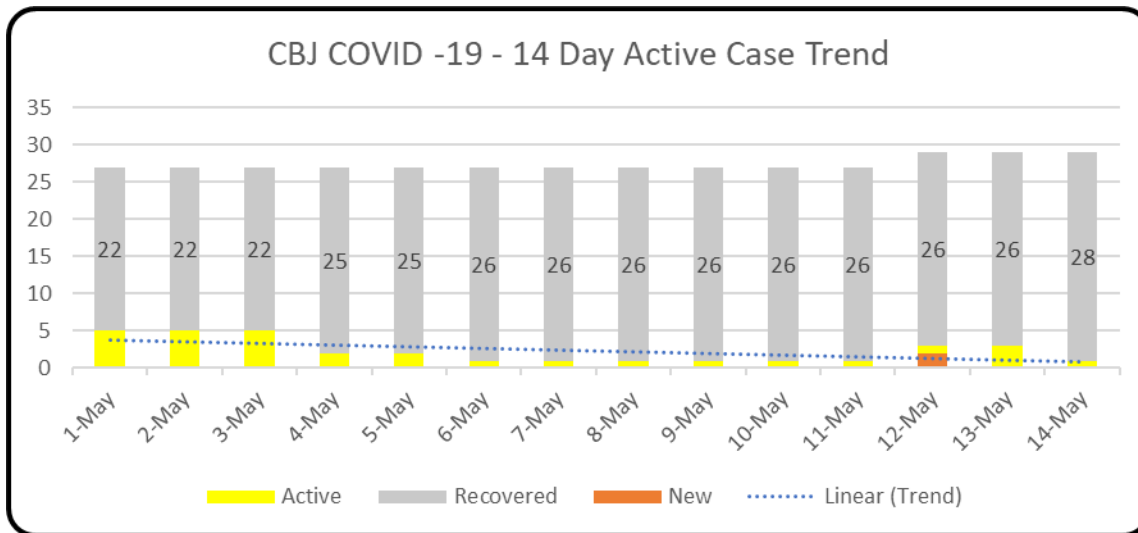
BRH reports adequate supply of PPE and no concerns related to workforce availability.

Issues of Note:

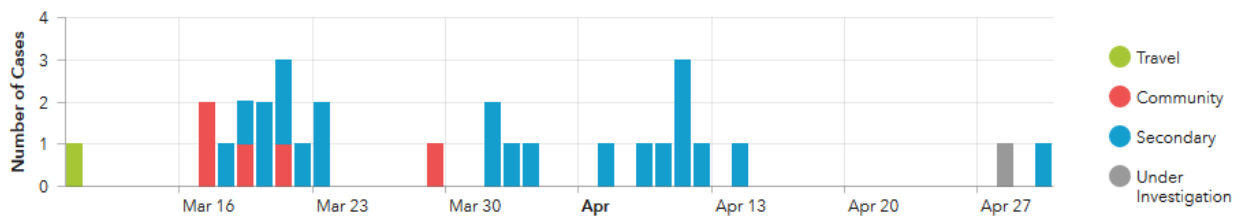
DPH is offering their services to consult with businesses who want to reopen safely.

Airport Screening: 97 passengers Monday. Will need more people as the flight numbers increase.

Mobile Screening/Community Paramedicine:

48 calls came into the hotline, 20 referred for testing, 20 appointments scheduled.

There were 22 tests at drive through, 13 of which were for medical related appointments. 3 were taken at home. To date, sampled 474 for testing.

2 welfare checks were completed via phone, 1 welfare check was completed at home.
