Situation Assessment: We are experiencing a high volume of new cases, a significant number of which are attributed to community spread. Our 14 day and 7 day case rate indicators are at the high alert level. The community is urged to take appropriate cautions and in particular to refrain from indoor, unmasked activities with individuals outside of family/social bubbles

Issues of Note:

The popup testing center at Centennial Hall is fully operational through 5:00 pm today. Sample counts: Friday: 283 Saturday: 168

Sunday: We don't have a final count yet, but the day was slower than the previous two.

The State lab in Fairbanks continues to have processing issues. They are back open but at a reduced rate. Some of our samples have been transferred to the Anchorage lab.


Disease Transmission/Contact Tracing:


There are no new resident and no nonresident cases reported for Juneau today. CBJ continues to show a higher number of resident and nonresident cases than what is reported on the state dashboard. In addition, our recovered numbers continue to be larger than what is being reported by the state. Both discrepancies are due to more timely local reporting.

The State of Alaska is reporting 62 new cases today bringing the statewide cumulative case count to 7,193.

Testing:

We did not receive updated testing numbers today.





This chart tracks the number of new cases in the past 7 days, controlled for population. King County (Seattle) and Multnomah County (Portland) are included for context and due to travel frequency. The source data for Alaska is from the SOA dashboard. Out of state data is from the Harvard Global Health Institute (https://globalepidemics.org/key-metricsfor-covid-suppression/) and generally lags a day behind most of our other reporting. Policy recommendations at varying levels (<1, <10, <25, 25+) can be found on their website
