Situation Assessment: Our overall number of positive cases has dropped off compared to previous weeks. Our 14 day case rate indicator is at the high alert level and is expected to drop in a day or two and our 7 day case rate indicator is at the moderate level. There is still community spread happening in the community and, as a result, people are urged to take appropriate cautions and in particular to refrain from indoor, unmasked activities with individuals outside of family/social bubbles.

Issues of Note:

EOC team members met today to assure we have a good safety net in place for populations that may need a little extra support when in quarantine and isolation.

We have a new case that is out at one of the mine sites. The person is isolated and close contacts have been quarantined.

Daily Numbers Report:

We are reporting 4 new cases today.

Disease Transmission/Contact Tracing:



There are 3 new residents and 1 new nonresident cases reported for Juneau today. 1 is community spread, 1 is secondary, and 1 is travel related and 1 is under investigation.

The state dashboard is showing a lower number of resident cases and nonresident cases than what is reported on the CBJ dashboard. In addition, our recovered numbers continue to be larger than what is being reported by the state. This is due to the timing of reporting. CBJ numbers are more accurate.

The State of Alaska is reporting 136 new cases today bringing the statewide cumulative case count to 8,912.

Testing:

117 test results were received with collection dates between 9/26/2020 – 9/28/2020. This represents a turnaround time of 2 – 4 days. The majority of tests returned at the 3 - 4 day mark.



This chart tracks the number of new cases in the past 7 days, controlled for population. King County (Seattle) and Multnomah County (Portland) are included for context and due to travel frequency. The source data for Alaska is from the SOA dashboard. Out of state data is from the Harvard Global Health Institute (<https://globalepidemics.org/key-metrics-for-covid-suppression/>) and generally lags a day behind most of our other reporting.
