Situation Assessment: Our 14 day case rate indicators is at the High alert level and our 7 day case rate indicator has dropped to the Moderate alert level. The disease continues to move across all disease acquisition types: community spread, secondary transmission, and travel. A more aggressive strain of COVID-19 has been identified in Alaska. We caution the public to strictly adhere to all health orders related to travel and to continue strict adherence to masking and social distancing when outside your immediate home.

Issues of Note:

JSD exposures (Riverbend Rally, Auke Bay classroom, JDHS/TM Boys Varsity/Junior Varsity) have resolved without any additional reported COVID positives.

Vaccine updates: 22.3% of the Juneau population age 16 and above have been vaccinated with 14.0% of the population having received their 2nd dose.

The second vaccine clinic – POD2(a) will occur on February 11 and 12 this week. The 2nd dose clinic will be March 4 – 5. The State of Alaska expanded vaccine eligibility today and the remaining appointments quickly filled. There is a waiting list posted for the clinic.

The State of Alaska [today](#) updated its eligibility guidelines for the COVID-19 vaccine. The next tier includes:

- People aged 50 years or above with a high-risk medical condition;
- People 50 years or above working as a frontline essential worker;
- Pre K-12 and child care education staff; and
- People living or working in other congregate settings.

We are working on estimating the size of this tier, however there are 6,666 people in the community who are between the ages of 50 and 65.

Daily Numbers Report:

We are reporting no new cases today.

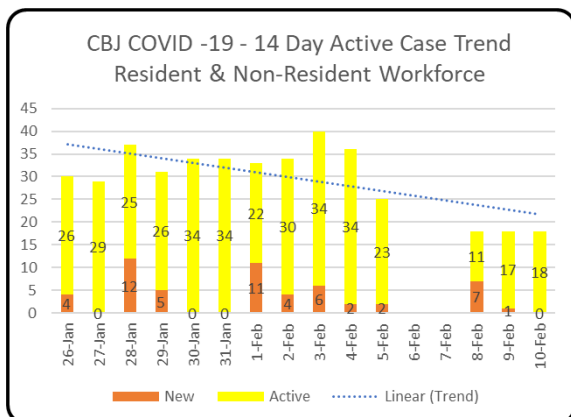
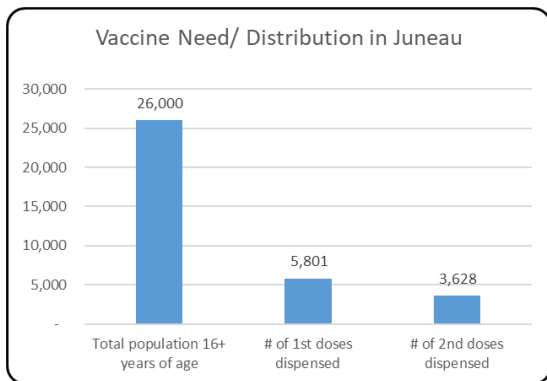
Disease Transmission/Contact Tracing:

We are reporting no new resident cases or nonresident cases today. The Wildflower Court cluster remains at 12 positives with 10 recovered. All cases at Wildflower Court are asymptomatic.

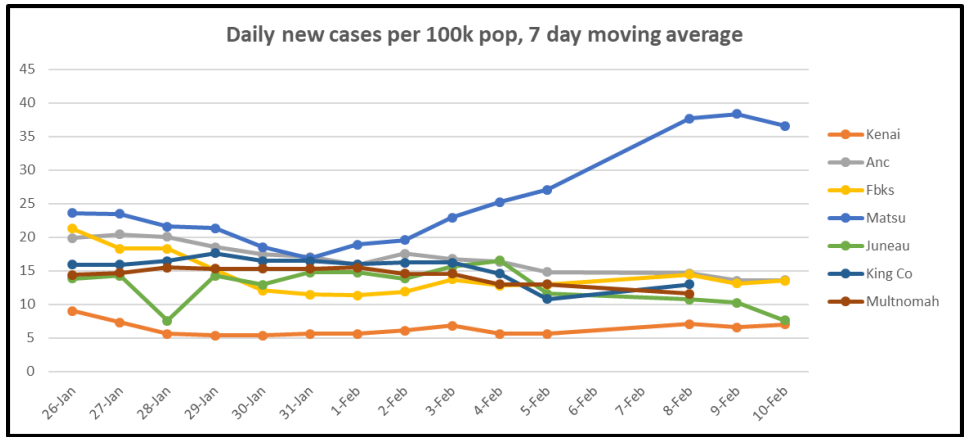
The State is reporting 116 new cases today bringing the statewide cumulative total to 55,893 cases.

Testing: Please note: We are in the process of determining how to report out airport testing with the conversion of operations to Capstone.

2/9/21: 31 test results were received from the Fulgent Lab with collection dates between 02/06/2021 – 02/08/2021 – 2 tests returned in 1 day, 17 tests returned in 2 days, and 12 tests returned in 3 days.
