Situation Assessment: Our 14 day case rate indicator is at the Moderate alert level and the 7 day rate indicator is at the Minimal alert level. The community continues to see COVID transmit via community spread, secondary infection, and travel. The more aggressive strain of COVID-19 has been identified in Alaska. We caution the public to strictly adhere to all travel related rules and to continue strict adherence to masking and social distancing when outside your immediate home.

Issues of Note:

Vaccine updates: 28.1% of the Juneau population age 16 and above have been vaccinated with 17.9% of the population having received their 2nd dose.

The March mass vax clinic will be on Friday March 12, noon to 7pm and Saturday March 13, 9am to 4pm. Appointments will open on Thursday, February 25th, at noon. An information release went out to the broader community today.

March Vaccine allocations:

Pfizer

• 2340 doses allocated to the CBJ/BRH/DPH/T&H/SEARHC mass vaccination clinic.

Moderna

- Costco, Family Practice Physicians, Lemon Creek Correctional, Ron's Apothecary, Southeast Medical Clinic, and Juneau Urgent Care: 100 each
- SEARHC: 300
- Fred Meyer and Safeway Pharmacies are now part of the Federal Retail Pharmacy Partnership program and will be receiving allocations directly through this federal program. We do not yet know what their March allocations are, but they will be in addition to these allocations. The State

reported out that they are working on mechanisms to include the doses coming from the federal allocations into the state dashboard.

We also expect to receive some vaccine from Johnson and Johnson in March, after the FDA's February 26 meeting, where it is expected it will be approved for emergency use.


Disease Transmission/Contact Tracing:


We are reporting 2 new resident cases and no new nonresident cases today. Both new cases are community spread. DPH conducted a records review and removed one older case that was a duplicate.


The State is reporting 210 new cases today bringing the statewide cumulative total to 57,405 cases.

<u>Testing</u>: Please note: We are in the process of determining how to report out airport testing with the conversion of operations to Capstone.

2/18/21: - 39 test results were received from the Fulgent Lab with a collection date of 02/16/2021 – all tests returned in 2 days.
