RE: Situational Update –Level 1 Minimal- Operational Period 30 (2/25/2021 – 3/25/21)

Situation Assessment: Our 14 day case rate indicator is at the moderate alert level and our 7 day case rate indicator is at the minimal alert level. The community continues to see COVID transmit via community spread, secondary infection, and travel. COVID vaccine distribution is on the rise, which should begin to offer the community some level of protection. The more aggressive variants of COVID-19 have been identified in Alaska. We continue to caution the public to strictly adhere to all travel related rules and to continue strict adherence to masking and social distancing when outside your immediate home.

Issues of Note:

Registration for POD 4a (3/15 - 3/20) is full. Sign up for the waitlist is underway. The second dose clinic (4b) will be scheduled for April 5 –11. This clinic is made possible through a cooperative effort with SEARHC.

The Governor announced yesterday evening that anyone in the state who is age 16 or older now qualifies for the vaccine.

We expect to hear about our April vaccine allocation by the end of next week. Once we know the amount, we will schedule additional clinics.



<u>Disease Transmission/Contact Tracing:</u>


We are reporting 2 new resident cases and no new nonresident case today. 1 case is community spread and the other is under investigation. The small business cluster is at 11 total positives with 10 recovered.


The State is reporting 150 new cases today bringing the statewide cumulative total to 59,917 cases.

<u>Testing</u>: 3/09/21: 17 test results were received from the Fulgent Lab with collection dates between 03/06/2021 – 03/08/2021 – 1 test returned in 1 day, 11 tests returned in 2 days, and 5 tests returned in 3 days.



32.6% of the Juneau population age 16 and above have been vaccinated with 26.2% of the population having received their 2nd dose. The State is reporting that 79.6% of the population in Juneau age 65+ have received at least the first dose of vaccine.
