Situation Assessment: Our 14 day and 7 day case rate indicators are at the moderate alert level. The community continues to see COVID transmit via community spread, secondary infection, and travel. COVID vaccine distribution is on the rise, which should begin to offer the community some level of protection. The more aggressive variants of COVID-19 have been identified in Alaska. We continue to caution the public to strictly adhere to all travel related rules and to continue strict adherence to masking and social distancing when outside your immediate home.

Issues of Note:

POD 4a is underway and runs through Saturday (3/20). The second dose clinic (4b) will be scheduled for April 5 –11. This clinic is made possible through a cooperative effort with SEARHC. We anticipate 2100 doses will be administrated.

POD 5a is scheduled for Tuesday, March 23rd. 1100 doses of Pfizer will be available. There are no appointments left for this clinic but a waitlist has been established. The second dose clinic (5b) will be held on Tuesday, April 13th.

We had a full Unified Command meeting today.

BRH: BRH is developing strategies and protocols for vaccine allocation for remaining health care workers and patients. They are actively working on vaccine POD planning. BRH has relaxed their visitor policy a little allowing now for up to 2 individuals who can visit a patient during their stay. They have one COVID positive patient in house. BRH is reviewing incident directives and impact on hospital operations. They continue to work on modifications for the new triage building.

JSD: The district is expanding in person learning. They have had no new cases since the last meeting. All staff who want to be vaccinated have received their first dose and many age eligible students are now going through the vaccination process as well.

Daily Numbers Report: We are reporting 2 new cases today.

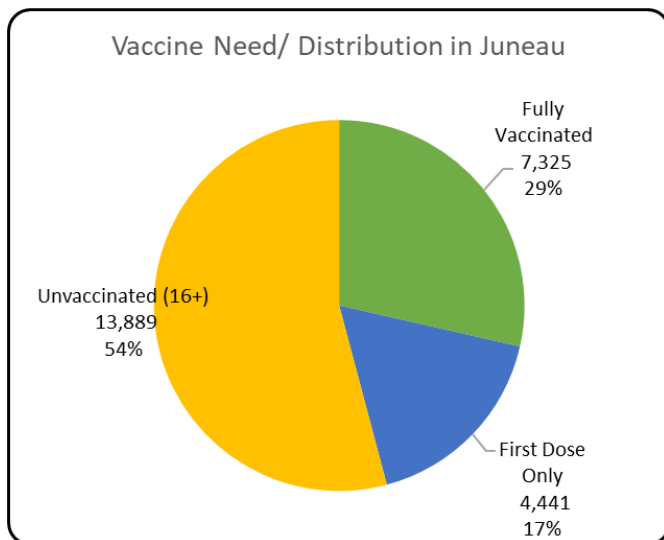

Disease Transmission/Contact Tracing:

We are reporting 2 new resident case and no new nonresident cases today. 1 case is community spread and the other case is under investigation.

The State is reporting 177 new cases today bringing the statewide cumulative total to 60,931 cases.

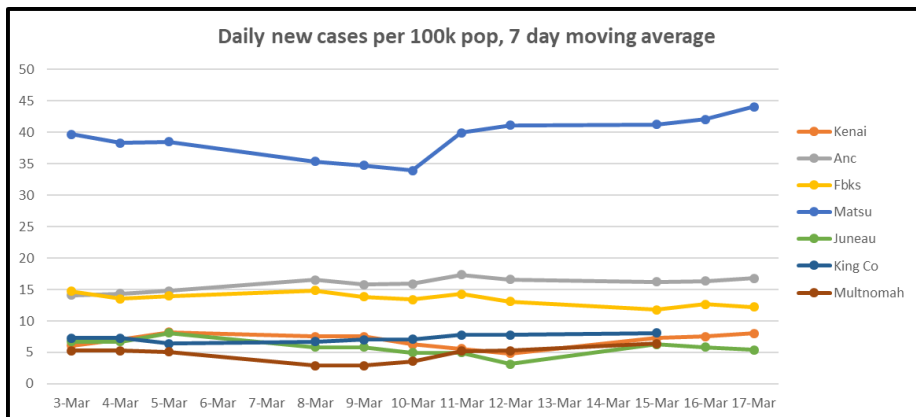
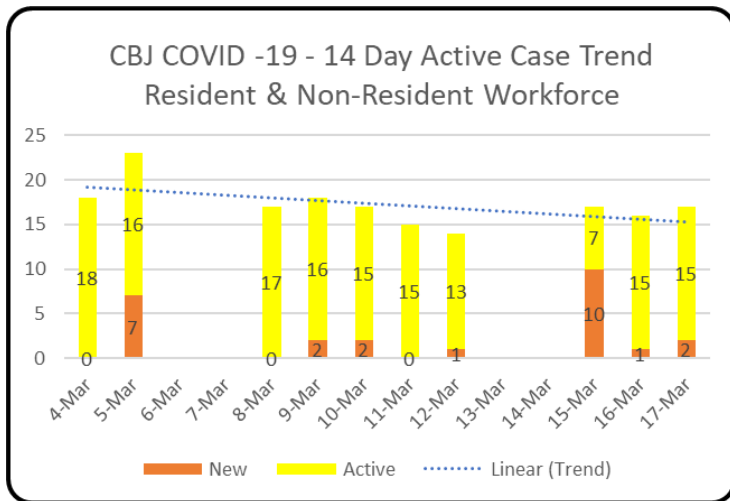
Testing: 45 tests were processed by BRH. Results were provided within 24 hours of testing.



22.9% of the total population of Juneau is fully vaccinated.

45.9% of the Juneau population age 16 and above have received at least 1 dose of vaccine and 28.6% of the age eligible population is fully vaccinated.

The State is reporting that 76.6% of the population in Juneau age 65+ are fully vaccinated.



This chart tracks the number of new cases in the past 7 days, controlled for population. King County (Seattle) and Multnomah County (Portland) are included for context and due to travel frequency. The source data for Alaska is from the SOA dashboard. Out of state data is from the Harvard Global Health Institute (<https://globalepidemics.org/key-metrics-for-covid-suppression/>) and generally lags a day behind most of our other reporting.
