**Situation Assessment:** Our 14 day and 7 day case rate indicators are at the low alert level. The community continues to see COVID transmit via community spread, secondary infection, and travel. Travel related cases are climbing. COVID vaccine distribution is on the rise which should begin to offer the community some level of protection. The more aggressive variants of COVID-19 have been identified in Alaska. We continue to caution the public to strictly adhere to all travel related rules and to continue strict adherence to masking and social distancing when outside your immediate home.

**Weekly Summary – 14 day lookback for positive tests collected March 8<sup>th</sup> –March 21<sup>st</sup>.**

Over the last rolling 14 day period, 19 people tested positive for COVID-19 in the community.

Highlights:

None of the cases were associated with a cluster

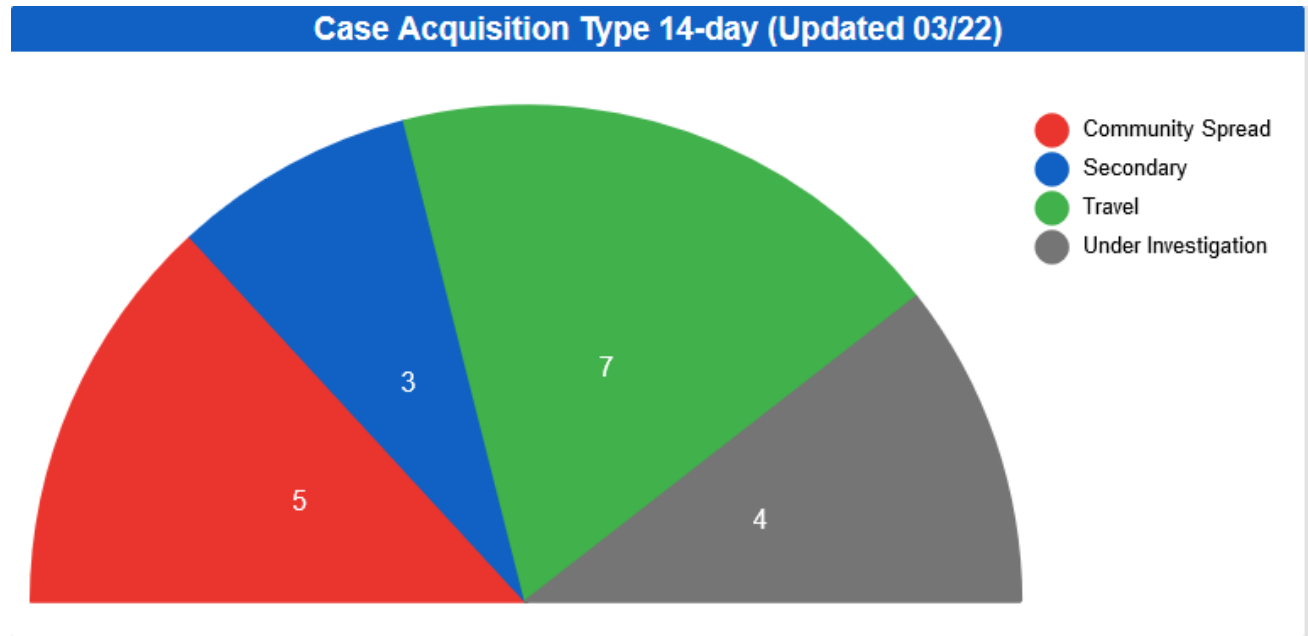
26% of the cases were designated as community spread, 16% of the cases were designated as Secondary Infection, 37% of the cases were associated with Travel, and the remaining 21% of the cases remain under investigation.

Contact tracing is improving with 100% of individuals being contacted within 24 hours of a positive test being returned.

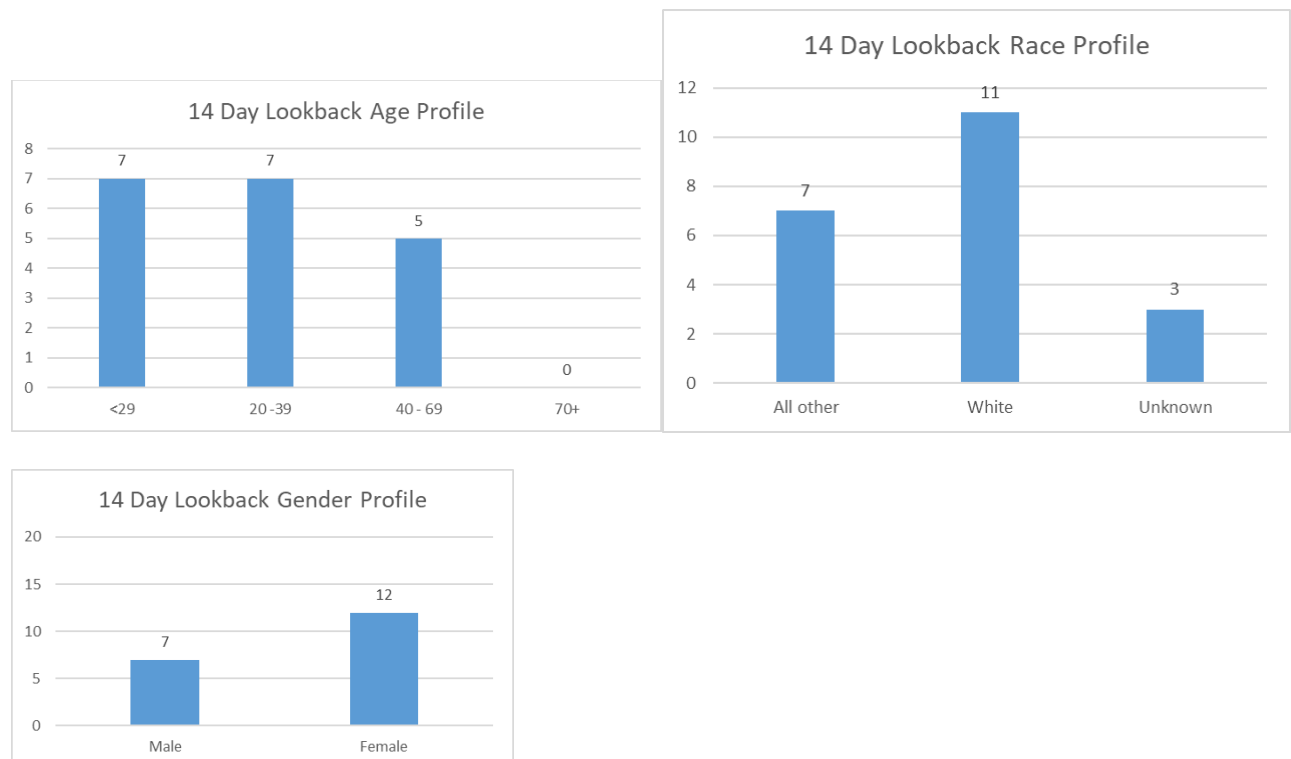
Disease spread is across all age groups, most racial groupings, and is more prevalent in females than males (63%/37%).

Disease Acquisition:

Of the 19 positive cases during the last 14 day period, 5 were identified as community spread, 4 were identified as secondary transmission, 7 were identified as travel related, and 4 remain under investigation.

**Issues of Note:**

CBJ will be hosting a Community Forum on Vaccines on Wednesday, March 24<sup>th</sup> at 5:00 pm. Dr. Zink, Dr. Urata, Ali Gottschlich (DPH), Charlee Gribbon (BRH), and Scott Watts will be panelists. Community members will have a chance to ask their question in advance and through the Q&A function in Zoom. The meeting will be streamed live on Facebook and recorded for future viewing.

April Vaccine Allocations: 2340 Pfizer, 800 Moderna, and 300 J&J. Pfizer will go to PODS and the Moderna and 200 J&J will go to pharmacies. 100 of the J&J will go to the BRH ER.

**POD Information:**

POD 4a concluded on Saturday. 2115 doses were administered. POD 4b (second dose clinic) will be held April 5 – 10.

POD 5a is scheduled for tomorrow (3/23). 1100 doses of Pfizer will be available. The second dose clinic (5b) will be held on Tuesday, April 13<sup>th</sup>.

POD 6A: is scheduled for April 5-8, 10am to 2pm. Registration for this clinic opened today at noon. POD 6B (Second dose clinic) is scheduled for April 26 – 29.

POD 7A: Will be held on April 9. This is a closed POD for age eligible High School students. POD 7A (Second dose clinic) will be held on April 30. Registration for these clinics will be conducted through the School District. Details will be forthcoming next week through the School District.

We are reporting 1 new resident case and no new nonresident cases today. The new case is travel related.

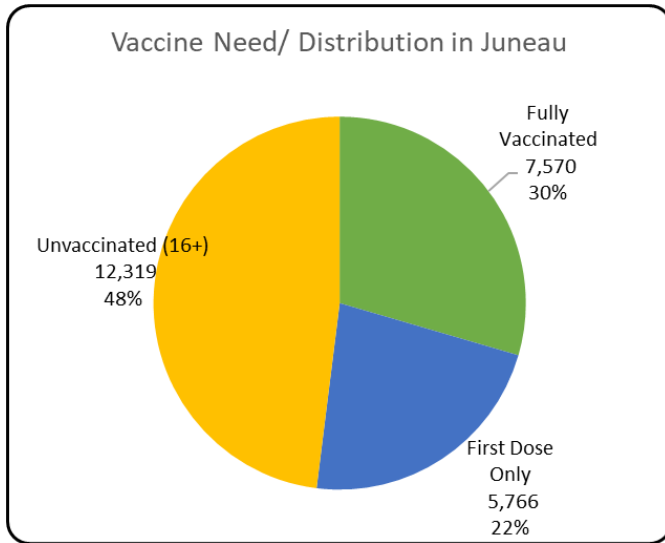
The State is reporting 52 new cases today bringing the statewide cumulative total to 61,514 cases. Including the statewide positives from today, there were 356 cases reported since last Friday (3/19).

**Testing:**

3/20/21: 27 tests all returned within 24 hours.

3/21/21: 36 tests all returned within 24 hours.

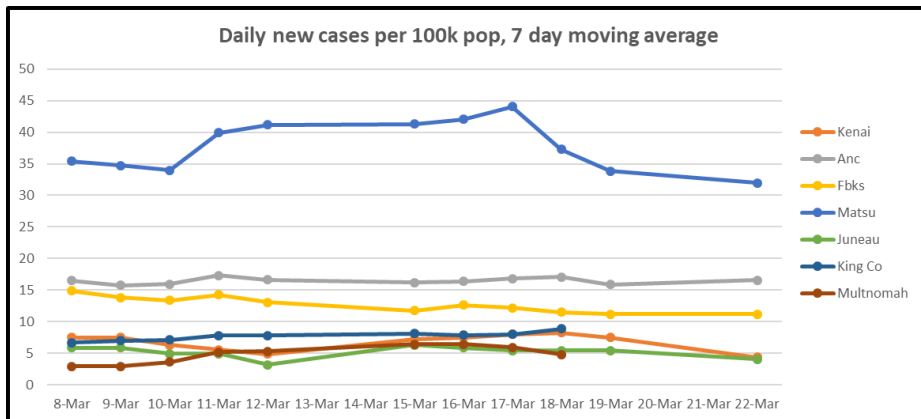
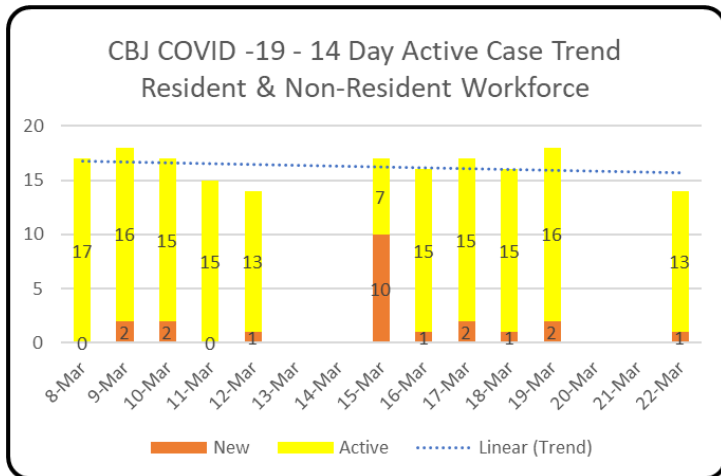
3/22/21: 17 tests all returned within 24 hours.



23.7% of the total population of Juneau is fully vaccinated.

52.0% of the Juneau population age 16 and above have received at least 1 dose of vaccine and 29.5% of the age eligible population is fully vaccinated.

The State is reporting that 77.15% of the population in Juneau age 65+ is fully vaccinated.



This chart tracks the number of new cases in the past 7 days, controlled for population. King County (Seattle) and Multnomah County (Portland) are included for context and due to travel frequency. The source data for Alaska is from the SOA dashboard. Out of state data is from the Harvard Global Health Institute (<https://globalepidemics.org/key-metrics-for-covid-suppression/>) and generally lags a day behind most of our other reporting.
