**Situation Assessment:** Our 14 day and 7 day case rate indicators are at the low alert level. The community continues to see COVID transmit via community spread, secondary infection, and travel. Travel related cases are climbing. COVID vaccine distribution is on the rise which should begin to offer the community some level of protection. The more aggressive variants of COVID-19 have been identified in Alaska. We continue to caution the public to strictly adhere to all travel related rules and to continue strict adherence to masking and social distancing when outside your immediate home.

Weekly Summary - 14 day lookback for positive tests collected March 15th -March 28th.

Over the last rolling 14 day period, 16 people tested positive for COVID-19 in the community.

### Highlights:

None of the cases were associated with a cluster


19% of the cases were designated as Community spread, 43% of the cases were designated as Secondary Infection, 19% of the cases were associated with Travel, and the remaining 19% of the cases remain under investigation.

Contact tracing is improving with 100% of individuals being contacted within 24 hours of a positive test being returned.


Disease spread is across all age groups, most racial groupings, and is more evenly spread between females and males (50%/50%).


## **Disease Acquisition:**

Of the 16 positive cases during the last 14 day period, 3 were identified as community spread, 7 were identified as secondary transmission, 3 were identified as travel related, and 3 remain under investigation.

#### **Issues of Note:**

Beginning this week, the EOC report will be published three times a week: Monday, Wednesday and Friday. If Monday is a holiday, the report will be published on Tuesday. The CBJ dashboard will be updated on a daily basis during Monday – Friday with the exception of State holiday. In general, the following information will be included: Monday – will include 14 day recap from the Division of Public Health. Wednesday – will include information from the full unified command meetings (BRH, JSD, etc.), and Friday – will include any travel related information.

Statewide, case numbers are trending up. Please see the 7 day rolling average chart for more detail.

A <u>community survey</u> about vaccines is now live. The purpose is to identify barriers and specific hesitancies among our population that will allow us to focus on specific groups with education and support. A mailer has been sent to all Juneau households and paper copies are being distributed at central locations. The survey has been translated into several languages for use by individuals who may be more comfortable responding in a different language.

#### POD Information:

POD 6A: is scheduled for April 5-8, 10am to 2pm. Registration for this clinic opened is open. 1630 doses were allocated for the clinic. Approximately 750 slots remain open – enrolment is slow but steady. POD 6B (Second dose clinic) is scheduled for April 26 - 29.

POD 7A: Will be held on April 9. This is a closed POD for age eligible High School students. POD 7A (Second dose clinic) will be held on April 30. Registration for these clinics will conducted through the School District. Details will be forthcoming next week through the School District.

Planning for future PODs – is underway this week. There may be one more large weekend POD and then a series of smaller, more targeted vaccination events. More details to follow.



#### Disease Transmission/Contact Tracing:

We are reporting 7 new resident cases and no new nonresident cases today. 2 cases are secondary, 2 are community spread, and 3 are under investigation.

The State is reporting 653 new cases over the three day weekend bringing the statewide cumulative total to 62,901 cases.


Testing: 138 tests were processed at BRH over the long weekend, all of which returned within 24 hours.




45.6% of the of the total population of Juneau has received at least 1 dose of vaccine and 25.0% are fully vaccinated.

56.9% of the Juneau population age 16 and above have received at least 1 dose of vaccine and 31.2% of the age eligible population is fully vaccinated.

The State is reporting that 77.9% of the population in Juneau age 65+ is fully vaccinated.





This chart tracks the number of new cases in the past 7 days, controlled for population. King County (Seattle) and Multnomah County (Portland) are included for context and due to travel frequency. The source data for Alaska is from the SOA dashboard. Out of state data is from the Harvard Global Health Institute (https://globalepidemics.org/key-metrics-for-covid-suppression/) and generally lags a day behind most of our other reporting.
