Situation Assessment: Our 14 day and 7 day case rates are at the moderate alert level. The community continues to see COVID transmit via community spread, secondary infection, and travel. COVID vaccine distribution is on the rise which offers the community a level of protection. A variant of concern (UK/B1.1.7) has been identified in Juneau. Case rates are statewide are high but beginning to even out. We continue to caution the public to strictly adhere to all travel related rules and to continue strict adherence to masking and social distancing when outside your immediate home.

Weekly Summary - 14 day lookback for positive tests collected April 5th -April 18th.

Over the last rolling 14 day period, 50 people tested positive for COVID-19 in the community.

Highlights:

20% of the cases were associated with a cluster involving a small daycare. To date, there have been 10 positive cases associated with that cluster.


28% of the cases were designated as Community spread, 40% of the cases were designated as Secondary Infection, 10% of the cases were associated with Travel, and the remaining 22% of the cases remain under investigation.

Contact tracing declined to 90% of individuals being contacted within 24 hours of a positive test being returned. Public Health anticipates this is a temporary reduction due to statewide numbers increasing.


Disease spread is across all age groups, most racial groupings, and is more prevalent in males than females (64%/36%).


Disease Acquisition:

Of the 50 positive cases during the last 14 day period, 14 were identified as community spread, 20 were identified as secondary transmission, 5 were identified as travel related, and 11 remain under investigation.

Issues of Note:

Planning for alternate POD sites continues as does communication and marketing around vaccines. Enrollment in the current PODs is slow but steady. Overall, **57**% of the Juneau population has received at least one dose of vaccine. We expect that 50% of the population will be full vaccinated (series complete +2 weeks) by May 14th.

The Vaccination planning team is planning logistics for a May vaccine POD through the School District. We are anticipating that the Pfizer vaccine will be authorized for ages 12 - 15 in early to mid May.

The Juneau Public Health Center, with the CBJ, will be hosting a walk-in vaccine clinic at the Juneau International Airport tomorrow, beginning at 9 am and ending at 4 pm or when vaccines run out. No appointment is needed – just show up. This walk-in clinic will be utilizing the Pfizer vaccine.

POD 10 A will be at the UAS Recreation Center and run from April 22 – 24 from 1:00 pm to 7:00 pm. This clinic will use Pfizer. The second dose clinic (10b) will be May 13 - 15.

74 doses were administered on Friday at POD 9a which was held at St. Brendan's Episcopal Church. The second dose clinic (9b) will be held on May 7th.

336 doses were administrated at POD 8 A on Saturday at Centennial Hall. The warm weather resulted in a higher than normal number of no shows. The second dose clinic (8b) will be held on May 8th.

Daily Numbers Report: We are reporting 13 new cases today (Friday 1:00 pm – Monday 1:00 pm).



Disease Transmission/Contact Tracing:

We are reporting 13 new resident cases and no new nonresident cases. 3 cases are community spread, 5 are secondary infection, 2 cases are travel, and 3 cases remains under investigation. 3 of the cases are associated with TMHS students and 1 of the cases is from the M/V Matanuska. The day care cluster is at 10 positives with 4 recovered.

That State is reporting 117 new cases today brining the statewide total to 66,390 cases. This is a total of 469 new cases since the last EOC report.


Testing: 486 COVID tests were processed at BRH between Tuesday April 13th and Monday morning, all tests returned in less than 24 hours.




Total: **57.0%** of the of the total population of Juneau has received at least 1 dose of vaccine and **46.7%** have completed their vaccine series.

16+: **70.6**% of the age eligible Juneau population has received at least 1 dose of vaccine. **57.9**% have completed their vaccine series.

65+: **93.0%** of the this age group has at least one dose of vaccine. **88.0%** has completed the vaccine series.
