**Situation Assessment:** Our 14 day case rate is at the moderate alert level and out 7 day case rate is in the high level. The community continues to see COVID transmit via community spread, secondary infection, and travel. COVID vaccine distribution is on the rise which offers the community a level of protection. A variant of concern (UK/B1.1.7) has been identified in Juneau. Case rates statewide are high but appear to be evening out. We continue to caution the public to strictly adhere to all travel related rules and to continue strict adherence to masking and social distancing when outside your immediate home.

## **Issues of Note:**

The cluster at TMHS remains at 7 with 0 recovered though not all positive cases are directly connected to the school. Directly connected is defined as staff or student. The small daycare cluster is at 10 with 10 recovered and will likely be closed out early next week.

## Vaccine clinics:

The Juneau Public Health Center hosted a walk-in clinic at UAS yesterday (62 doses given) and is also hosting walk-in clinics at UAS today and tomorrow. The second dose clinics (10b) for these will occur May 13 - 15.

There will be two clinics downtown on Monday, April  $26^{th}$ . 12:00 - 4:30 at Resurrection Lutheran in coordination with their Foodbank hours. Also 5:00 - 6:30 at the Catholic Church on  $5^{th}$  street.

Second dose clinics for PODs 6b (4/26 - 4/29) at Centennial Hall and 7b (4/30) at the high schools run next week.

We continue to use the Pfizer vaccine at all clinics.

**Daily Numbers Report:** We are reporting 3 new cases today (Wednesday 1:00 pm – Friday 1:00 pm).



## <u>Disease Transmission/Contact Tracing:</u>

We are reporting 2 new resident cases and 1 new nonresident case. 1 case is secondary infection, 1 is travel, and 1 remains under investigation.

That State is reporting 143 new cases today brining the statewide total to 67,059 cases. This is a total of 669 new cases since the last EOC report.


Testing: 209 COVID tests were processed at BRH between over the last two days, all tests returned in less than 24 hours.




Total: **58.3%** of the of the total population of Juneau has received at least 1 dose of vaccine and **49.2%** have completed their vaccine series.

16+: **72.2**% of the age eligible Juneau population has received at least 1 dose of vaccine. **61.0**% have completed their vaccine series.

65+: **93.4**% of this age group has at least one dose of vaccine. **88.3**% has completed the vaccine series.
