Situation Assessment: Our 14 day and 7 day case rates are at the moderate alert level. The community continues to see COVID transmit via community spread, secondary infection, and travel. A variant of concern (UK/B1.1.7) has been identified in Juneau. Case rates statewide appear to be evening out. We continue to caution the public to strictly adhere to all travel related rules and to continue strict adherence to masking and social distancing when outside your immediate home.

If case activity stays at Level 1, the community will move to Level 1b on May 12th.

Issues of Note:

Capstone has been designated as the apparent successful bidder in the State's RFP for providing vaccines at the airport. The protest period is running now. It is anticipated that vaccines will begin to be offered at airports around the state, including Juneau, on May 15th. At least to begin with, Pfizer and Moderna will be used for that purpose.

There are a number of clinics planned for May throughout the community. Many of these clinics were originally set up as 2nd dose clinics which will now also be offering the Janssen vaccine. Clinics for youth ages 12 – 15 will be announced as soon as the FDA approval is announced which is expected on May 12th. High School clinics are likely to be scheduled May 14 with Middle School clinics on May 17. Clinics will be open to any youth 12 and up and any of their family members who wish to be vaccinated regardless of school enrollment status.

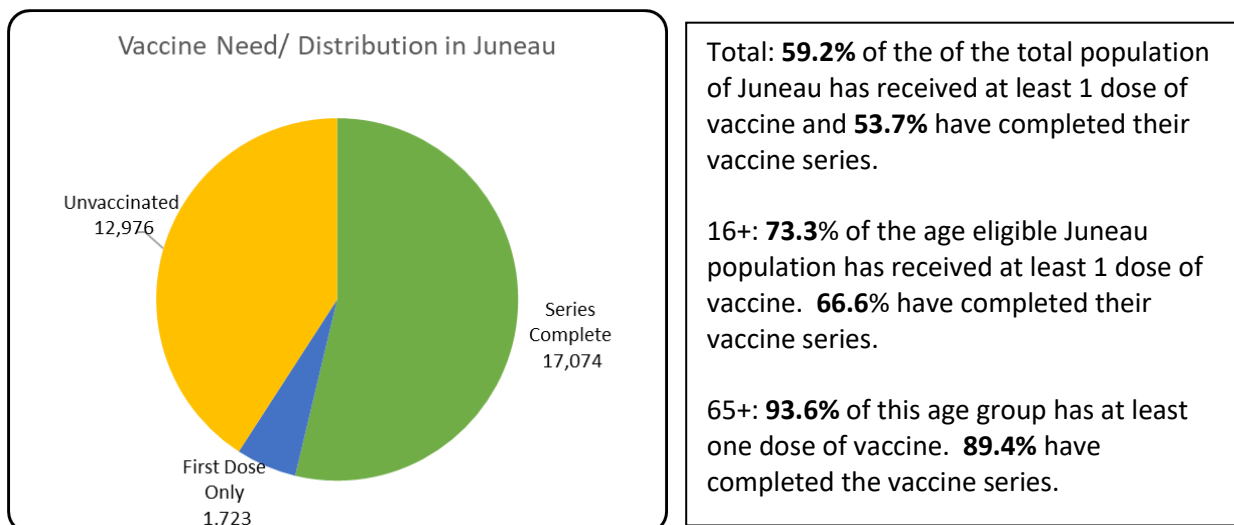

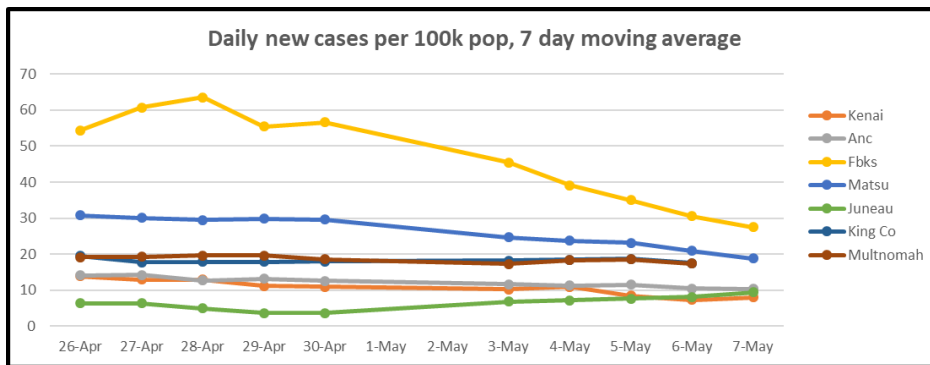
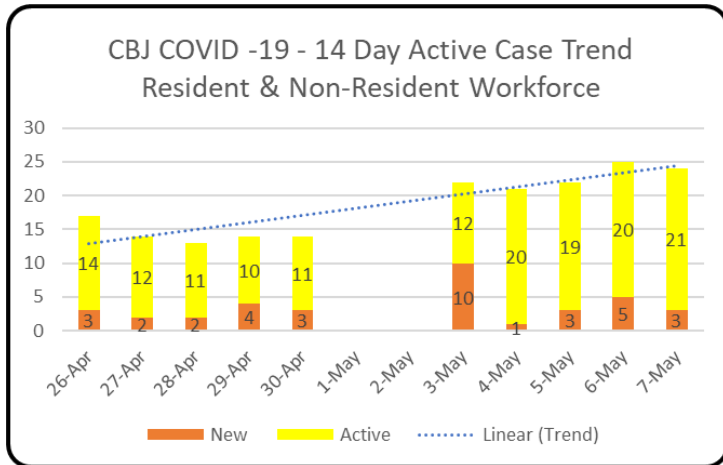
Disease Transmission/Contact Tracing:

We are reporting 8 new resident cases and no new nonresident cases. 2 cases are secondary transmission, 3 cases are secondary infection, 1 case is travel, and the remaining 2 cases are under investigation. The private gathering cluster is still at 6 positive cases. 4 of the new cases are associated with the school district. JSD has contacted anyone who may have been impacted.

That State is reporting 116 new cases today bringing the statewide total to 68,880 cases. This is a total of 214 new cases since the last EOC report.

Testing: 224 COVID tests were processed at BRH between over the last two days, all tests returned in less than 24 hours.





This chart tracks the number of new cases in the past 7 days, controlled for population. King County (Seattle) and Multnomah County (Portland) are included for context and due to travel frequency. The source data for Alaska is from the SOA dashboard. Out of state data is from the Harvard Global Health Institute (<https://globalepidemics.org/key-metrics-for-covid-suppression/>) and generally lags a day behind most of our other reporting.
