Situation Assessment: 14 day and 7 day case rates have dropped to the minimal alert level. The community continues to see COVID spread in the community with a higher proportion of cases occurring in youth under the age of 19. Two variants of concern have been identified in Juneau - (UK/B1.1.7 and Brazil/P1). Case rates statewide are declining.

Weekly Summary - 14 day lookback for positive tests collected May 17th -May 30th

Over the last rolling 14 day period, 24 people tested positive for COVID-19 in the community.

Highlights:

There were no cases associated with a cluster.


25% of the cases were designated as community spread, 43% of the cases were designated as Secondary Infection, 16% of the cases were associated with Travel, and the remaining 16% of the cases remain under investigation.

Contact tracing is at 100% of individuals being contacted within 24 hours of a positive test being returned.


Disease spread is proportionally higher among individuals under the age of 19 and less prevalent in those over the age of 60. There is case positivity among most racial groupings, and more cases in females than males (57%/43%).

Disease Acquisition:

Of the 24 positive cases during the last 14 day period, 6 were identified as community spread, 10 were identified as secondary transmission, 4 were identified as travel related, and 4 remain under investigation.

Issues of Note:

A new variation of concern has been identified in Juneau. South Africa B.1.351. This variant is thought to be more transmissible but once transmitted, does not cause more serious illness than normal COVID.

CBJ is partnering with the Chamber of Commerce to incentivize vaccinations in the month of June. The Chamber is providing \$20 gift cards for anyone receiving a first dose in June. Gift cards are available from a variety of Juneau Businesses. In addition, any one who receives a first or second dose between June 1st and June 29th will also be entered into a drawing for a \$1,000 prize. In all, 5 \$1,000 prizes will be awarded.

COVID screening for unvaccinated people working with children and in environments where exposure to travelers is more likely will begin this week. Screening is available at no cost on a weekly basis. Details of the program are being sent out through relevant employers. Children participating in residential camps are also eligible.



Disease Transmission/Contact Tracing:

We are reporting 10 new resident cases and 3 new nonresident cases. 1 case is community spread, 5 cases are secondary infection, 4 cases are travel, and the remaining 3 cases are under investigation.

That State is reporting 51 new cases today bringing the statewide total to 70,319 cases. This is a total of 111 new cases since the last EOC report.


Testing: 143 COVID tests were processed at BRH since the last EOC report, all tests returned in less than 24 hours. 153 tests were taken at the community level from 5/24 - 5/30.




Total: **64.1%** of the of the total population of Juneau has received at least 1 dose of vaccine and **58.5%** have completed their vaccine series.

12+: **74.7**% of the age eligible Juneau population has received at least 1 dose of vaccine. **68.2**% have completed their vaccine series.

65+: **89%** of this age group has at least one dose of vaccine. **87%** have completed the vaccine series. (State updated dashboard)





This chart tracks the number of new cases in the past 7 days, controlled for population. King County (Seattle) and Multnomah County (Portland) are included for context and due to travel frequency. The source data for Alaska is from the SOA dashboard. Out of state data is from the Harvard Global Health Institute (https://globalepidemics.org/keymetrics-for-covid-suppression/) and generally lags a day behind most of our other reporting.
