Don D. Statter Harbor Facilities Dredging & For-Hire-Floats

(Statter Improvement Phase IIIA & IIIB)

Ribbon Cutting Ceremony

May 14, 2021

With 70 reserved slips and over 10,000 linear feet of transient moorage, Don D. Statter Harbor Facility is one of the busiest in Alaska. Local recreational boaters, commercial fisherman, yachts, pleasure cruisers and tour operators frequent this facility for its amenities and geographic location. Following the adopted 2006 Statter Harbor master-plan, Phase I demolished DeHart's Marina and established new reserved mooring floats in 2013. Phase II constructed the new launch ramp facility in 2017. Phase III provides For-Hire-Floats and will be completed in multiple contractual segments.

These For-Hire-Floats provide additional loading and moorage for the tour and charter vessel industry. Amenities include year-round potable water, two year-round sewer pump-out systems and increased shore power connections for future electric vessel charging. The gangway and floats were designed for accommodating large groups of visitors embarking on tours of our amazing backyard.

Phase IIIA began in 2019 with the dredging work performed by Pacific Pile & Marine and their subcontractors. A large excavator mounted on a barge dug the soft marine sediments and disposed of them via a self dumping scow. A bedrock outcropping also required removal, so after dredging, a drilling pad was constructed and blasting holes were drilled into the bedrock. Two successful blasts reduced the rock to rubble which was removed to create the new basin with a depth of minus 16 feet below MLLW. Phase IIIB work began in the fall of 2020 with Trucano Construction Company and their subcontractors to build a concrete block wall, construct wooden floats, install steel piles, add a second access gangway to the Statter Harbor Facility and provide new utilities.

In 1966, Don D. Statter was appointed Alaska Director of the Division of Waters & Harbors with responsibilities for the development of harbors statewide. He was also on the Juneau Docks & Harbors Board and provided the vision for the facility here in Auke Bay today. He passed away in 1988 and his wife Anita remains a resident in Juneau.
