om These are enforced on a calendar year basis so make sure you have your 2023 permit before heading out with your vessel.

Port Director's Corner: With the arrival of the NCL BLISS on April 17th, we enter into the bustling cycle of summer management and operational execution. Though the preparation required to meet waterfront demands both in support of the tourism industry as well as commercial fisheries and recreational users is a year round proposition, April always marks a milestone month. In addition to facility maintenance, repairs and cleaning, Docks & Harbors continues to recruit new employees. Currently our needs are for part-time limited Harbor Technicians starting at \$21.23/hour, more information can be found here.

Public Outreach for Proposed Docks & Harbors Rate Increase: On February 23rd, 2023 the D & H Board affirmed by motion: "To accept the findings of the HDR Report and direct Staff to begin a process, with Board engagement to raise fees 9% across the Docks Enterprise and Harbor Enterprise". The first community meeting will be 6 pm on Tuesday, April 4th at Mendenhall Valley Library (and via Zoom). The second community meeting will be 6 pm on Tuesday, April 18th at the Yacht Club (and via Zoom). The D & H Board will consider input from these outreach meetings and make implementation recommendations at its May 17th Operations & Planning Committee meeting and its May 25th Regular Board meeting.

Aurora Harbor Phase III: The plans and specifications for the next phase is currently being advertised and bid opening is scheduled for April 12th. Assuming a successful outcome, the Assembly will approved bid award at its April 17th meeting. The engineer's estimate is \$4M. Due to supply chain challenges, the performance period for the general contractor has been extend for a completion date of May 2024.

Statter Harbor Management Guidelines: Effective this year, transient Statter vessels must clear the harbor every 10 days to be eligible for the monthly moorage rate, otherwise the daily rate will apply. The details are in 05 CBJAC 25.060 - Summer management.

Peratrovich Plaza, Marine Park, Cruise Ship Terminal, and the Columbia/Tram Lot policies and procedures for vehicles and vessels for the 2023 season will be provided by Docks & Harbors. D & H preseason meetings are scheduled April 13th, 9:30am- noon in Assembly 8:00am-4:30pm Chambers. Please note these are required Statter Harbor meetings. Bring a copy of the 2023 TBMP 907-789-0819 guidelines for reference. Finally, please plan Monday-Friday to sign up for TBMP at the meeting if you 8:00am-4:30pm have not done so already.

Except for a loading zone, from May 1 through September 30 each year, a vessel may moor at the facility, including the breakwater, for up to ten consecutive calendar days, after which the vessel must clear the facility, under its own power, for at least six consecutive hours. Vessels which do not clear the facility for at least six consecutive hours after any ten-day period shall be assessed the daily fee in accordance with 05 CBJAC 20.070. A vessel owner may request an exception to this rule by submitting a request in writing to the Harbormaster, who may grant the request in writing upon a showing of exigent circumstances by the vessel owner. Unless directed otherwise by the Harbormaster in accordance with procedures established under this regulation, all moorage during this period shall be on a first-come, first-served basis. Federal DOT Grant Submission: Not later than April 28th, D & H will be submitting a US DOT Maritime Administration (MARAD) - PIDP (Port Infrastructure Development Program) grant to construct an Aurora Harbor Drive-Down Float. We envision this float to be

very similar to the Auke Bay Loading Facility (ABLF) and is estimated to cost approximately \$11M. With ongoing lease deliberations with the University of Alaska, we have decided not to pursue any grant opportunities on shortterm leased property. The Port Director is requesting letters of support from businesses and individuals who would like to see a downtown drive-down float constructed. Please email carl.uchytil@Juneau.gov with questions.
