The meeting will be in Assembly Chambers and via Zoom. This public hearing follows a requisite 21-day public notice process which was initiated on August 31st. This action is the result of multiple years of evaluation, studies, and public outreach. After the public hearing, the Board will make motions and forward recommendations to the Assembly for regulation adoption. The Assembly will, most likely, take up this action at the October 23<sup>rd</sup> Assembly meeting. The Board @juneau.gov. **Douglas Harbor Lighting Improvements:** Docks & Harbors has completed an installation of a street light pole at the head of the launch ramp. This will greatly improve safety, especially for hunter/boaters launching at this facility during these fall months. 2023 Alaska's Harbormaster-of-the-Year. Juneau's Matt Creswell was recognized as the Alaska Harbormaster-of-the-Year by the Alaska Association of Harbormasters & Port Administrators (AAHPA) at its annual conference on September 28<sup>th</sup> in Ketchikan. The citation read in part...Demonstrating great expertise and skill, he leads a dynamic, everchanging operational tempo in managing Juneau's \$250M port and harbor infrastructure portfolio and 50+ personnel. This calendar year, Juneau welcomed 1.6M cruise ship passengers, breaking the 2019 record and a 25% increase from 2022. Supervising the operations of the four small boat harbors with vessel capacity of 1250, Mr. Creswell competently serves the Juneau community with pride and integrity...He has undertaken a focused effort to ensure compliance with non-moving, derelict vessels - a process demanding steadfastness but also empathy in dealing with unique patron situations. The efforts have vielded the desired effect of fewer derelict vessels and turnover of moorage space, which is especially pertinent in our Statter Harbor transient harbor... Mr. Creswell is most deserving to receive the praise and accolades from his peers throughout the state as this year's AAHPA Harbormaster-of-the-Year.



**Deputy Harbormaster Jeremy Norbryhn recognition:** At the Alaska Association of Harbormasters & Port Administrators (AAHPA) annual conference, Jeremy was recognized as our employee of the year. The citation read in part...Since his arrival in March 2021, he has been a positive influence not only with the public but in the professional development of our staff. As Statter Harbor

supervisor, Jeremy responded to numerous Alaskan winter events including sunken and impounded vessels, extensive snow removal, as well as departmental training, program recertification, facilities maintenance and preparation for the upcoming summer season...We have received numerous compliments on his ability to cooperate and collaborate with harbor patrons and businesses relying on our facilities. **Harris Harbor Security Gate:** Docks & Harbors is evaluating products to install a security gate to the one gangway into Harris Harbor. When installed, this will be the first security gate at a municipal facility in Alaska. The direction to harden our security posture in Harris Harbor was the result of harbor patrons communicating to the Docks & Harbors Board. Once installed this winter, we will evaluate the success and determine whether other harbor facilities would benefit from increased security. Currently, D & H staff is reviewing gates/security fencing quotes from contractors proposing to supply the materials for the requested work.

**Text Messaging Notification:** D & H established a SMS (Short Message Service) account which will allow harbor patrons to "opt in" for short text messages pertaining to D & H operations. Our goal is to inform the public of vital (or timely) information. This will be used to notify patrons of harbor utility outages, severe weather conditions or topical items for debate from the Harbor Board. There is no cost to sign up and interested citizens must "opt in" to receive these notification. Scan the QR code on the right to sign up.
