### PROPOSITION NO. 1

#### *Split Existing Bond Authorization*

#### **Explanation**

In 1999, voters approved a general obligation bond for two school district projects: renovation of Juneau-Douglas High School and a new high school at Dimond Park. Before the City and Borough may issue the bonds under this authorization, the State of Alaska must approve at least 50% reimbursement for both projects. The State has approved 70% reimbursement for the renovation project, but has not yet approved any reimbursement for the new high school. Splitting the existing bond authorization will allow the renovation of JDHS to proceed without delay. This proposition does not authorize any new debt.

#### **SPLITTING THE EXISTING GENERAL OBLIGATION BOND AUTHORIZATION**

\$59,900,000

May the \$59,900,000 in general obligation bond debt originally authorized by the voters on October 5, 1999, for the combined purpose of paying the cost of renovating Juneau-Douglas High School and constructing and equipping a new high school at Dimond Park be split into either or both of the following two principal amounts:

- not to exceed \$12,995,900 for the renovation of Juneau-Douglas High School which has qualified for 70% State reimbursement under the State's School Construction Bond Debt Reimbursement Program;

- not to exceed \$46,904,100 for the construction and equipping of a new high school at Dimond Park if the project qualifies for 50 percent or more State reimbursement of related Bond debt service at the time the Bonds are issued?

## NOTICE OF REGULAR MUNICIPAL ELECTION—OCTOBER 2, 2001

Notice is hereby given that a Regular Municipal Election will be held in the City & Borough of Juneau, Alaska on the **2nd day of October, 2001**. The polls will be open from **7:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m.** on Election Day. Polling places are shown below. Registered voters of the State of Alaska who reside within the City and Borough of Juneau are eligible to vote in this election. Voters should be prepared to display identification at the polling place when voting.

### The purpose of the election is:

1. To elect from candidates residing in the entire City and Borough of Juneau, one Areawide Assemblymember for a term of three years;
2. To elect from candidates residing in Election District No. 1, one Assemblymember for a term of three years;
3. To elect from candidates residing in Election District No. 2, one Assemblymember for a term of three years;
4. To elect from candidates residing in the entire City and Borough of Juneau, two members of the School Board for two terms of three years each; and
5. To vote on the following areawide proposition:

### PROPOSITION NO. 1

#### Explanation

In 1999, voters approved a general obligation bond for two school district projects: renovation of Juneau-Douglas High School and a new high school at Dimond Park. - not to exceed \$46,904,100 for the construction and equipping of a new high school at Dimond Park if the project qualifies for 50 percent or more State reimbursement of related Bond debt service at the time the Bonds are issued?

#### **VOTER QUALIFICATIONS**

To be eligible to vote in the City and Borough of Juneau election, you must be:

1. Qualified to vote in state elections;
2. A resident of the municipality for at least 30 days immediately preceding the election;
3. Registered to vote in state elections at a residence address within the municipality at least 30 days before the municipal election at which the person seeks to vote; and
4. Not disqualified under Article V of the State of Alaska Constitution.

### **ABSENTEE VOTING FOR THE MUNICIPAL ELECTION**

The Clerk's Office has absentee ballot applications available for residents who will be out of town on October 2, 2001, municipal election day, and would like to vote.

Voters seeking to have a ballot mailed to them must complete a written request or absentee ballot application, available from the Clerk's Office or the CBJ web site at:

It is not necessary to complete an absentee ballot application to apply for a ballot. The voter is allowed to request a ballot via written request.

The written request **must** contain the voter's name; **a residence** address in Juneau; the address where the ballot is to be mailed; and, for identification purposes, either the voter's social security number, voter number, or birthdate. The voter **must** also sign and date the request.

The voter must meet the following deadlines to have a ballot mailed to them:

**Postmarked by September 25, 2001**, if submitted by **mail**  
**Received on September 27, 2001 by 4:30p.m.**, if submitted by **facsimile**

In-Person Absentee Voting will be available in the Assembly Chambers of the **Municipal Building** between 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m., Monday through Friday, beginning Monday, September 17, through Monday, October 1, 2001, as well as Saturday, September 29, from 10:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.

In addition, an In-Person Absentee Voting Station will be available in the **Mendenhall Mall**, between 10am - 2 pm, and 3 pm - 7 pm, Monday through Friday, beginning Monday, September 17, through Monday, October 1, 2001, as well as Saturday, Sept. 29, from 10:00 - 5:00 p.m.

Persons who are ill or unable to go to the polls, who still wish to vote, should contact the Clerk's Office to make arrangements for an absentee ballot by personal representative.
