Notice is hereby given that a Regular Municipal Election will be held in the City & Borough of Juneau, Alaska on the **7th day of October**, **2003**. The polls will be open from **7:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m.** on Election Day. Polling places are shown below. Registered voters of the State of Alaska who reside within the City and Borough of Juneau are eligible to vote in this election. Voters should be prepared to display identification at the polling place when voting.

The purpose of the election is:

- 1. To elect from candidates residing in the entire City and Borough of Juneau, a Mayor serving areawide for a term of three years;
- 2. To elect from candidates residing in Election District No. 1, one Assemblymember for a term of three years;
- 3. To elect from candidates residing in Election District No. 2, one Assemblymember for a term of three years;
- 4. To elect from candidates residing in the entire City and Borough of Juneau, three members of the Board of Education (School Board) for terms of three years each; and one member of the Board of Education (School Board) for a term of two years; and one member of the Board of Education (School Board) for a term of one year; and
- 5. To vote on the following areawide propositions:

PROPOSITION NO. 1

Explanation

This proposition will authorize the issuance of \$6,945,000 in general obligation bond debt for the purpose of making the following renovations, upgrades and improvements to School District facilities:

Floyd Dryden Middle School Renovation Phase II; and Harborview Elementary School plumbing piping replacement.

Specific project funding provisions and estimated property tax impacts

- These projects meet the requirements for 70% State of Alaska reimbursement under the State's School Construction Bond Debt Reimbursement Program.
- It is estimated the City would receive reimbursements from the State of \$6,295,800 or 70% of the total cost. This assumes the Legislature fully funds the debt reimbursement program. The State reimbursement program is subject to annual appropriation by the Legislature.
- To obtain reimbursement from the State, the project funding must be in the form of a bond issue and issued for a minimum period of 10 years.
- The estimated total cost of the projects (including interest) is \$8,994,000. This amount assumes the Bonds are issued in the principal amount of \$6,945,000, mature over a 10-year period and bear interest at an average rate of 5% per annum.

- The City (taxpayers) would pay \$2,698,200 or 30% of the total estimated cost.
- Annual taxes of \$10 per \$100,000 of assessed value would be levied to retire the debt. Again, this assumes the State fully funds the debt reimbursement program.
- Annual operation and maintenance costs should not materially change as a result of these projects.

- 3. Registered to vote in state elections at a residence address within the municipality at least 30 days before the municipal election at which the person seeks to vote; and
- 4. Not disqualified under Article V of the State of Alaska Constitution.

ABSENTEE VOTING FOR THE MUNICIPAL ELECTION

A qualified voter may vote an absentee ballot for any reason. An absentee ballot may be cast in person, or requested from the election official in writing, by application with the voter's signature.

By Mail:

Application for a by mail ballot must be received in the office of the Municipal Clerk not less than seven days before the election for which the absentee ballot is sought. For the 2003 Regular Election, applications for by mail ballots must be received no later than **Tuesday**, **September 30**, **2003**.

It is not necessary to complete an absentee ballot application *form* to apply for a ballot. Voters are allowed to request a ballot by submitting a written request. The written request must contain the voter's <u>name</u>; a <u>residence address</u> in Juneau; the <u>address where the ballot is to be mailed</u>; and, for identification purposes, either the voter's <u>social security number</u>, voter number, or birthdate. The voter must also <u>sign</u> and date the request. Please include a contact phone number.

By Fax:

A qualified voter may vote by fax beginning 15 days before and through the close of the polls on election day. The voter must submit a written request for a fax ballot to the election official's office no later than 5:00 p.m. the day before election day. An absentee ballot that is completed and returned by the voter by fax must contain the following statement: "I understand that by using fax transmission to return my marked ballot, I am voluntarily waiving a portion of my right to a secret ballot to the extent necessary to process my ballot, but expect that my vote will be held as confidential as possible."

The signed application for a fax ballot must be received in the City Clerk's Office no later than **5:00 p.m.** on Monday, October 6, 2003.

When a completed application for a faxed ballot has been received, a ballot will be faxed, along with instructions for marking and submitting the voted faxed ballot.

In-Person Absentee Voting:

A qualified voter may vote absentee in person on or after the 15th day before an election up to and including the election day.
