Sr. Class History

Consolidation of the Juneau and Douglas schools did not occur until 1955, so until then there were two high schools, one in Douglas and one in Juneau. The initiation of the twelve Douglas Freshmen into their high school days was a memorable one! It lasted only a half day, but that was long enough. That night to prove their sportsmanship, they gave a Freshmen Frolic party. These twelve elected Della Cuthbert, President; Dave Gray, Vice President; Nince Milot, Secretary. Their advisor was DeWiley Holeman. All the Freshman boys were on the basketball team. Joe Poor was on the first five. The student body elected Della Cuthbert and Jeri Novak as cheerleaders.

Meanwhile, the Freshman Class of J-Hi was also being introduced to the beginning of their exciting high school years. Their initiation lasted all day, and the Sophomores held a dance for them that night. Four very capable officers were elected by the Freshmen: Stu Whitehead, President; Janet Greely, Vice President; Janie Hollenbach, Secretary; Ann Ghiglione, Treasurer. Mr. Eide was advisor.

In 1956 the two Sophomore classes joined forces. They elected David Gray, President; Chris Hudert, Vice President; Dottie Hixson, Secretary; Jeri Novak, Treasurer. Their advisor, Mr. Moore, guided them through another fun packed year. To swell the treasurery, pom poms were sold. Joe Poor and Stu Whitehead were on the Varsity basketball team. Chris Hudert was cheerleader.

The Junior year was really tops. David Gray, Andy Pekovich, and Don Nowacki were added to the varsity team. Janie Hollenbach, Chris Hudert, and Judy Pym cheered the Crimson Bears to victory as they became Southeast Alaska Champs. Juniors on the ski team, which traveled to Anchorage, were: Nicky Card, Judy Pym, Mary Shields, and Dave Lindstrom. Ass. Totem Editor was Dottie Hixson; Ass't. J-Bird Editor, Anne Grisham; Ass't. Business Manager, Mary Shields. These girls headed Publications in their Senior year. David Gray was ASB Vice President. Track Manager was George Sundborg. One of the distinctions of being upperclassmen was fulfilled in a hectic but successful Hot Dog Sale. Also, shiny class rings were distributed to some very proud wearers! The Junior Prom, one of the super events of the year, was very nicely carried out with the theme of Dreamland. Scott Wingfield led the Juniors as President; Don Nowacki, Vice President; Yogie Bost, Secretary; Martha Cole, Treasurer. Mr. Darnell was class advisor.

To begin an active last year, Frank Baxter was chosen Senior Class President; Andy Pekovich, Vice-President; Mary Tanaka, Secretary; Dixie Johnson, Treasurer. David Gray was elected ASB President and Martha Cole Secretary-Treasurer. Much to the pleasure of the Seniors, Mr. Darnell was again advisor. New members of the A squad were: Frank Palmer and Tom Grant. Stu Whitehead was captain of the team and Sandy Sturrock was the manager. Song queens were Jeri Novak and Karen Lynch. Leaders of the various organizations were: Pep Club, Marsha Erwin; Rifle Club, Jim Boddy; Girls' Club, Janie Hollenbach; Ski Club, Judy Pym; GAA, Yogie Bost; Majorettes, Karen Lynch. Climaxing four years filled with memories, the Class of '58 held their Senior Sneak, and then GRADUATION!!








"Just heavenly" is a perfect description of the Class of '58's Senior Ball held on the evening of December 20.
