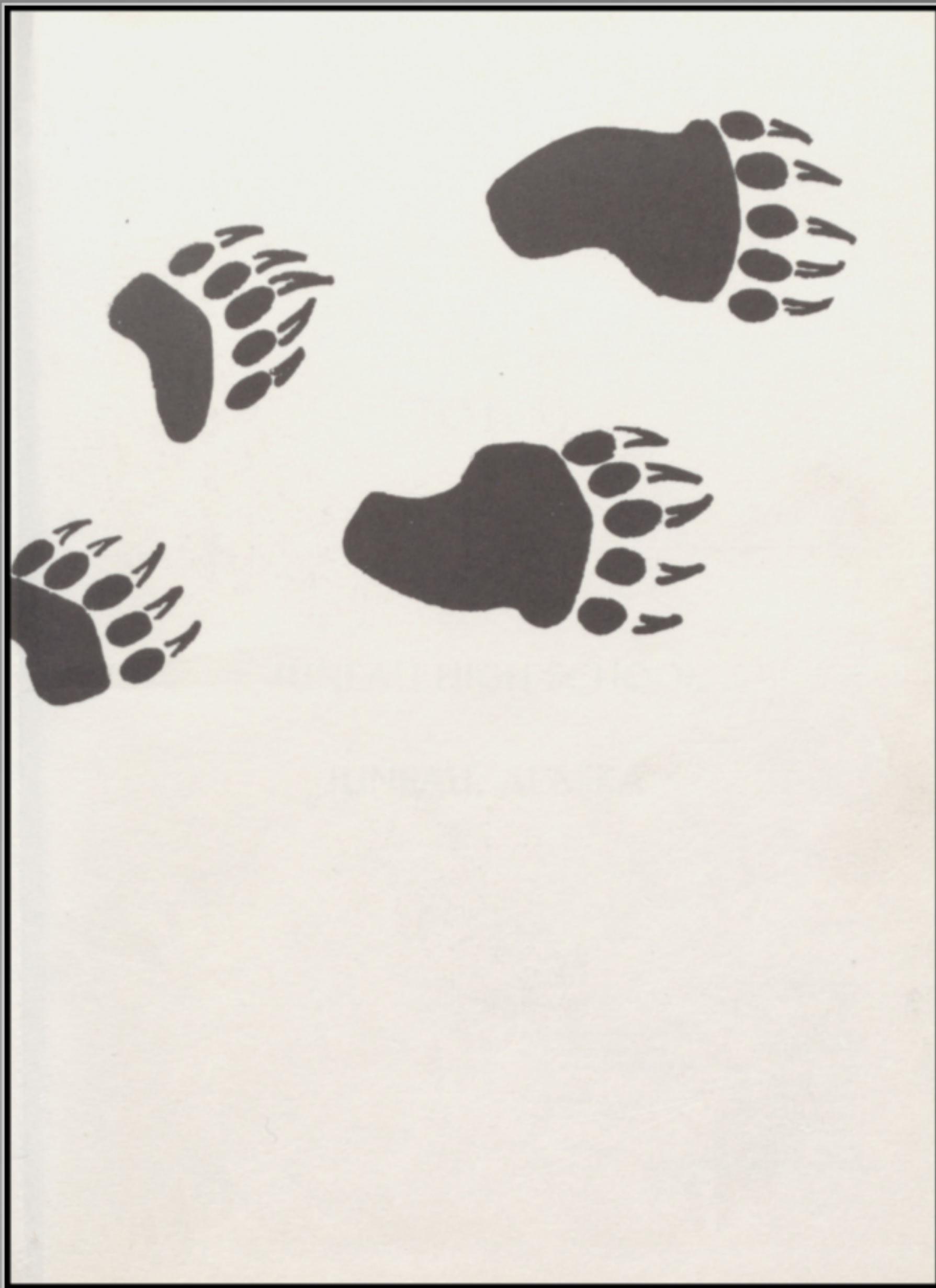


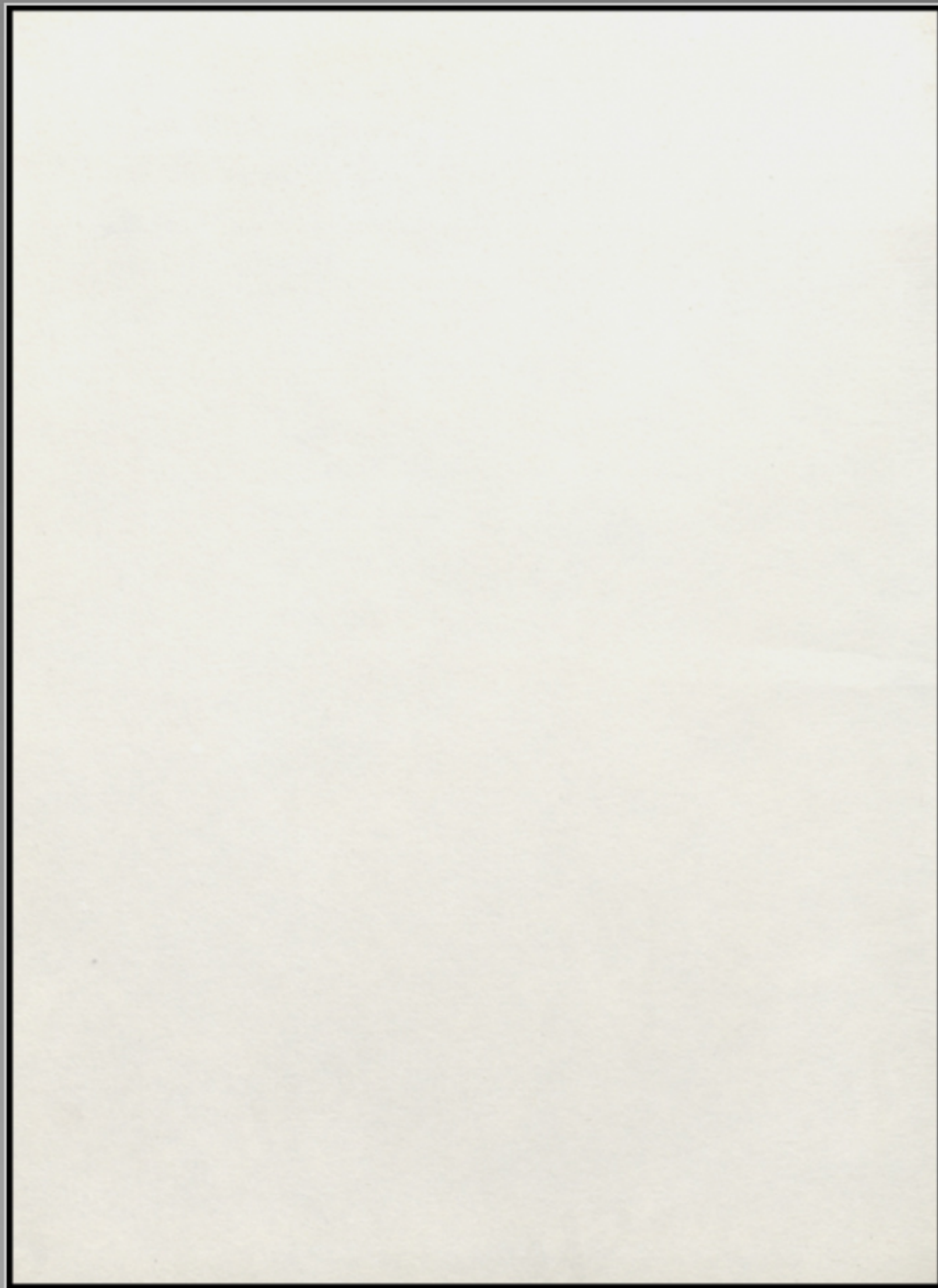

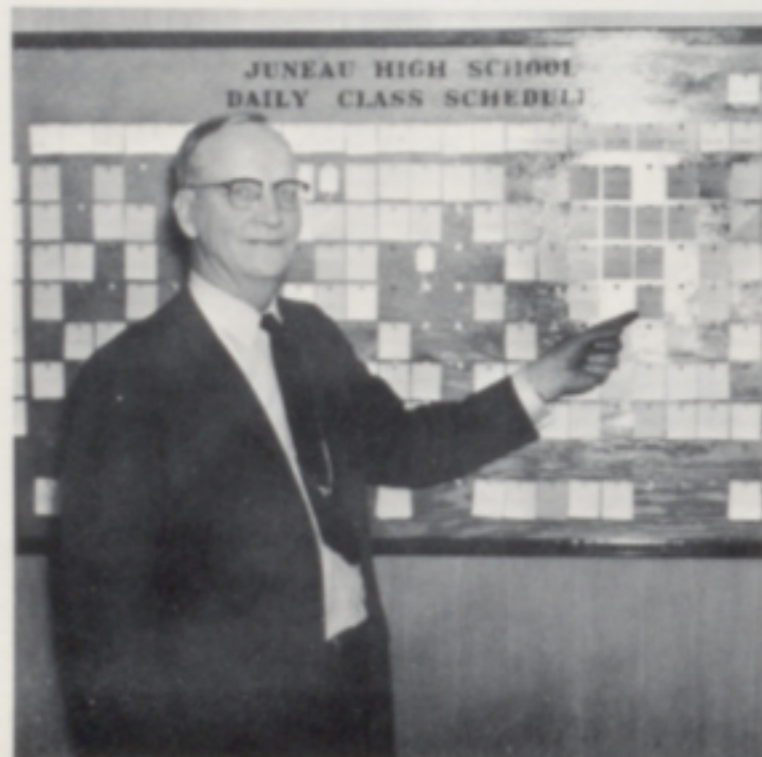

Senior Class History

Beginning their high school career at the Fifth Street School building, the Class of '61 survived an old-fashioned initiation to host the sophomores at a Hell Day Dance. Breaking with established tradition, the freshmen were led by four girls: President, Marianne Argetsinger; Vice President, Jackie Honeywell; Secretary, Pam Sands; and Treasurer, Bonnie Bryson. Mr. Michael Kirk was class advisor.

In February, the student body moved at last to the beautiful new J-High on Glacier Avenue, and the following month, the Crimson Bears became All-Alaska Basketball Champs.

For the 1958-59 school year, the Class of '61 elected Stu Burness, president; John Gissberg, secretary; Dennis Shuman, vice president; and Walter Swap, treasurer.

Following a successful freshman initiation, the sophomores set to work enthusiastically on their big money making project--selling scarlet and black J-High book covers.

As juniors, the class saw Juneau High School take first place in every event it entered, hosting the Alaska Championship Basketball and Ski Tournaments and the Southeast Debate Tourney.

With the arrival of class rings early in the spring, the juniors settled down to concentrate all their energy in planning for the Junior Prom, held in April. "Black Magic" was chosen as the theme.

Winding up the year, the juniors held their annual picnic at Mendenhall Glacier and decorated for Baccalaureate and Commencement.

Officers were Chick Featherstone, president; Dale Shuman, vice-president; Arlene Bowers, secretary; and Bonnie Bryson, treasurer.

Mighty seniors at last, the class of '61 began their busiest year by electing Walter Swap, president; Ladd Macaulay, vice-president; Dale Terry, secretary; Bonnie Bryson, treasurer; and Nedra Walther, class representative to the Student Council. Mr. Kirk and Mr. Hillburn worked together as class advisors.

Seniors became commencement conscious early in the fall when graduation photos and announcements were selected and a Dress Up Day was held. Senior ladies hosted the Freshman girls at the October Big and Little Sister Banquet.

The first major class project was the Senior Ball in December, closely followed by the class play and variety show, which boosted the class treasury substantially.
