




### STUDENT AIDES




### VARSITY CHEERLEADERS
















### DRILL TEAM





















### WE'VE GOT THE SPIRIT






## VICTORY WITH STYLE.









# J.D. SWIM TEAM IS NO.






#### NATIONAL HONOR SOCIETY
