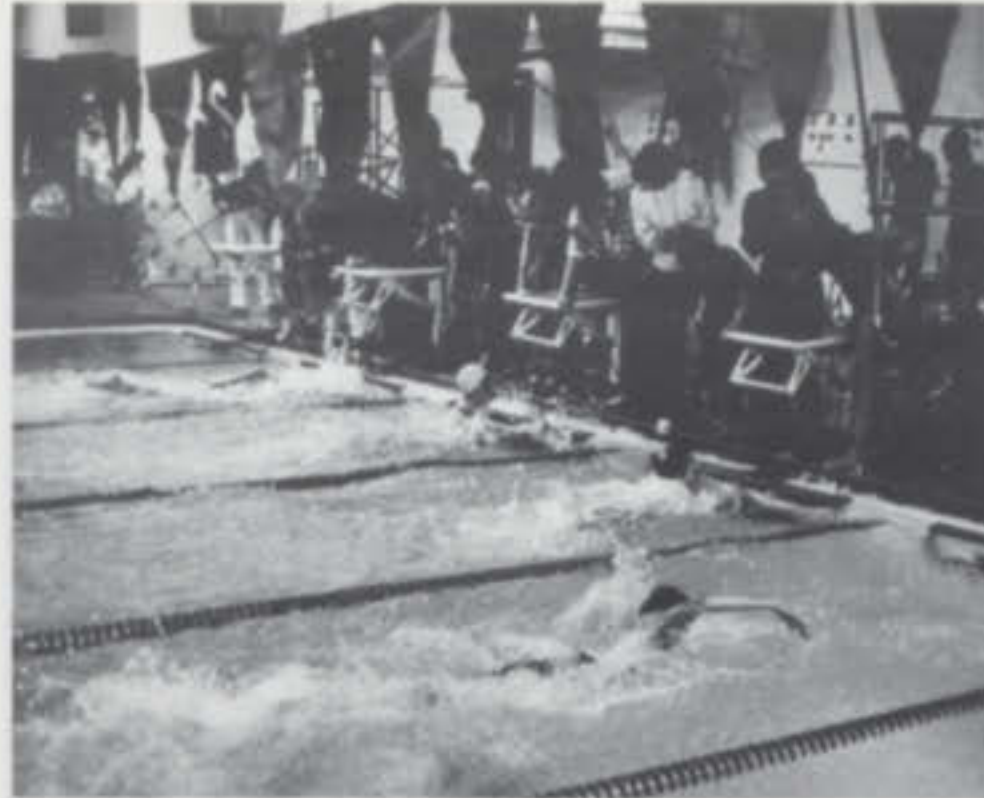
This year was successful and the cross-country team is looking forward to another terrific year to come.
