RE: Planning Workshop Update

The meeting was a success! I was very impressed with everyone's involvement in the group table discussions.

There were 28 attendees. One Aero Services person came from their Ketchikan office. A Coast Guard officer stayed for a short while. The others were a good representation of the airport tenants and users.

The presentations took 35 minutes, about 1 ½ hours for the three different group discussions and around 15 minutes for listing and voting on the different ideas and suggestions. The ideas reflected who sat together. There was one floatplane-oriented group, another had mostly helicopter people and the third was a mixed group.

There were 14 ideas. Nine of the 14 ideas received votes. The top three vote-getters were 1) change dredge and fill sequence to RSA, NW Quadrant and NE Quadrant, 2) have helicopter operations stay where they are and spread them out, and 3) construct public access road on the south side of the relocated Duck Creek that goes from east to west.

Each person had six votes. They could vote for separate ideas or place their votes on one idea. Not everyone voted, so you will notice that the total number of votes do not match the number of attendees.

I have attached a list of the ideas, meeting handouts and a few photographs.

The ideas on the list reflect the thoughts and opinions of those who participated in this meeting. If there were fewer helicopter or seaplane people at the workshop, the results would most likely change.





CONFLICTS

> Alaska Air Cargo - Northstar Helicopters

There are conflicts with Alaska Air Cargo freighter parking and Northstar helicopter landings and movement area.

➤ Aero Services Equipment Parking/Storage – New Hangars/Tie-Downs

There is a need for a storage area for Aero Services ground support/cargo handling equipment and fuel trucks when they are displaced by new hangars and aircraft tie-down area.

➤ Aero Services – More Space for Business Jets/GA
Aircraft

There are times when their existing ramp cannot handle their parking needs and some aircraft park in areas adjacent to their leased ramp.

- ➤ Multiple Helicopter Operations Airplane/Vehicle Ground Operations
 - Costal Helicopters There are conflicts with helicopter operations and vehicles traveling on adjacent roadway/GA aircraft parked in the adjacent tie-down area.
 - North Star Helicopters There are conflicts with helicopter operations and vehicles traveling on the adjacent roadway.
