Competent voice control means your dog must be within your sight and under verbal control at all times, regardless of distractions (such as wildlife, other dogs, food, or other park visitors). If your dog jumps on, barks at, or acts aggressively toward people or other dogs, chases wildlife, or will not consistently come to you immediately upon command, your dog must be leashed.

Definitions

08.05.010

Competent voice control means when all the following are met:

The person exhibiting the voice control is present with the animal and monitors all of its activities;

The person exhibiting the voice control is capable of directing all of the animal's movements and activities by voice commands; and

The animal under voice control follows all of the vocal commands quickly and accurately.
