  - a) Deposits to the Sustainability Fund -

Marc Matsil gave an update on various funding possibilities for the valley pool ground source heat pump (Rasmussen foundation; Alaska Energy Authority; CBJ) and need for Commission's support for funding request being made to Assembly.
