Summary: On November 1st, 2006, at approximately 1:18 AM, a resident from Kodzoff Trailer Park called the Juneau Police Department and reported that someone had shot the windows out of their trailer.

Upon officer's arrival, they confirmed that multiple shots were fired from a gun into the trailer's bay window. Officers contacted a couple and their child inside the trailer and determined that none of them received injury. Officers searched the immediate area and did not locate any suspect(s). It is believed the shooting was a result of a disagreement that occurred at a local bar.

JPD investigators were called and processed the crime scene. The case is currently under investigation. Anyone with information regarding this incident is encouraged to call JPD at 586-0600.

Update
Lt. Ed Mercer November 1st, 2006

As a result of this investigation, five local men were contacted and detained by JPD officers. Subsequently, 19 year old Chaz Allen Izatt was charged with Criminal Mischief in the Third Degree and Tampering with Physical Evidence (both Class C Felonies). 18 year old Tyrone Greg Beverly was charged with Criminal Mischief in the Third Degree and Misconduct Involving a Weapon in the Second Degree (Class B Felony). Both Izatt and Beverly were placed under arrest and were lodged at the Lemon Creek Correctional Center with no bail. The other three men were interviewed and released.

The investigation revealed Izatt, Beverly, and two other men drove to the Kodzoff Trailer Park to confront a male they believed was involved in a fight at a local bar with one of the suspect's family members. The person they believed to be involved in the fight was not living at the trailer. The trailer had been rented to a new uninvolved party. While at the trailer Izatt vandalized the trailer while Beverly fired a handgun into the residence multiple times.

Several Search Warrants were obtained and served at two separate Valley locations. Evidence was seized. The investigation continues and additional charges may be pending.
